BYLAWS

LOS ANGELES ROD AND REEL CLUB (A Non-Profit Corporation)

ARTICLE I

The name of this organization shall be LOS ANGELES ROD AND REEL CLUB, and its office shall be in the City of Los Angeles, California, or at such place or places as the Board of Directors may from time to time determine.

ARTICLE II DIRECTORS

SECTION 1. The direction and control of the affairs of the Corporation shall be vested in a Board of Directors, consisting of 9 active members who shall be elected in the manner set out below, and who shall serve for a term of two years beginning at the annual meeting in February of each year and continuing until the election and installation of their successors.

SECTION 2. As soon as conveniently possible after December 1, and before each annual meeting, the Board of Directors for the following year shall elect from their own number a President and a Vice President, and from their own number or from the active membership shall elect a Secretary, a Treasurer, and a Historian. Each and all officers thus elected shall take office at the annual meeting in February, and shall hold office for the period of two years or until the election and installation of their successors.

ARTICLE III DUTIES OF OFFICERS

SECTION 1. The President shall preside at the meetings of the members and at the meetings of the Directors. The President shall only vote to cast the deciding vote in case of a tie. The President shall perform all duties usually incident to the Office of the President.

SECTION 2. The Vice President shall perform the duties of the President in the latter's absence.

SECTION 3. The Secretary shall:

A. Keep an accurate record of the proceedings of the Board of Directors and of the membership.

B. Call meetings as provided in the bylaws.

SECTION 4. The Treasurer shall:

A. Keep the books and accounts and a detailed statement of receipts and expenditures, and furnish a copy thereof to the Secretary and Board of Directors each month.

B. Receive all funds and place them in a depository designated by the Board of Directors, so that all funds may be regularly deposited and accounted for.

C. Issue all checks as ordered by the Board of Directors authorizing the withdrawal of funds from the depository, and see that the signatures required by the Board of Directors are affixed thereto.

D. Submit a statement of the financial condition whenever requested by the Board of Directors.

SECTION 5. The Historian shall keep records of catches, statistics, and other notable events in the history of the Club.

ARTICLE IV MEMBERSHIP

SECTION 1. All anglers in sympathy with the objects of this corporation shall be eligible for membership upon the approval of the Board of Directors.

Termination of any membership at any time shall require the unanimous approval of the Board of Directors.

SECTION 2. The membership will consist of the following classes:

A. Active Members: All members of the same household living at the same address that are 18 years or older. Only individuals of the same household listed on the initial application for membership form or on the annual dues renewal form will be considered active members. Members of the household who are under 18 years of age will be considered junior members if so requested. A member of the household who turns 18 in any given year will be considered an active member in the next following year, if so indicated on the dues renewal form. Life Members are Active Members.

B. Junior Members: Anglers under the age of eighteen (18) years. A junior member need not reside in the same household as an active member but each junior member must have an active member sponsor.

C. Inactive Members: Any current member in good standing, who because of illness or adverse financial circumstances, is unable to participate actively in the affairs of the Club, provided such angler makes a written or verbal request to the Board of Directors to be placed in the class of inactive Membership. Final approval of membership status to Inactive Membership shall require a majority vote by the Board of Directors. Inactive status shall be reviewed annually by the Board of Directors and may be continued or discontinued by a majority vote of the Board of Directors. A Distinguished Member, who requests an Inactive Membership, shall be granted Inactive status without Board of Directors approval.

D. Honorary Members: The Board of Directors may, from time to time, by majority vote elect to Honorary Membership persons possessing the qualifications deemed sufficient to warrant such action. Honorary members shall not be required to pay any fees or dues to this corporation. It is the intent of this membership classification to honor those non-members who over a continuing period of time have given their support to the Los Angeles Rod and Reel Club, and/or made significant contributions to the sportfishing community.

The Board of Directors shall review the status of every Honorary Member not less than every two years, and, by majority vote, shall determine if such Honorary Member continues to possess the qualifications as an Honorary Member and, if not, such Honorary Member shall be removed as an Honorary Member.

E. Distinguished Member: The Board of Directors may each year, by a 66 2/3% majority, elect to the status of Distinguished Member not more than five (5) Active Members who, because of their long standing, dedication and service to the Los Angeles Rod and Reel Club, possess the qualifications deemed sufficient to warrant such action. Further qualifications for Distinguished Member status are twenty (20) years of active membership and service at one time as an Officer and/or Director of the club and /or trustee of the Foundation.

H. Non-Resident Member: This classification of membership shall be available to anglers who reside outside the State of California. A Non-Resident Member shall have all the privileges of the Club, except the right to vote or hold office. The initiation fee and dues for Non-Resident Member shall be 50% of the active member rate.

I. Life Member: The Board of Directors may each year, by a 66 2/3% majority, elect to the status of Life Member, a Distinguished Member who has accrued 30 years of continuous membership. This is the most prestigious honor that a member may achieve. A Life Member will not be required to pay dues. A Life Member is a de facto Active Member.

SECTION 3. Active Members shall have the privilege of voting and holding office. Only Active Members shall have all rights, title, or interest in the assets of the corporation. Membership and any right arising there from shall be nontransferable, and all rights of a member in the corporation or in its assets shall cease upon death or other termination of membership.

SECTION 4. As a condition precedent to membership, it is necessary for a prospective member to attend at least two of any of the following events prior to being accepted as a member:

- 1. Regular dinner meetings**
- 2. Annual awards event**
- 3. Annual Kids' Fishing Trip**
- 4. Marine Mentors' Trip**
- 5. Kids' Trout Derby**
- 6. Family Picnic**

Or any other event the board of directors deems appropriate as a condition set forth in this section.

This qualification shall not apply to "Non-Resident" members applications.

In addition, a prospective member's application shall be signed by at least one active member sponsor(s) who have fished with the prospective member and certify by their signing that the prospective member is an angler in sympathy with the objectives and values of the Club.

For purposes of the pre-admittance the requirements of an Active Membership as set forth in this Section 4, may be met by any member of the household over 18 years of age

At such time as the Club is in receipt of an application from an applicant that has met all criteria for membership as provided for in this Section 4, such applicant's name shall be circulated to the general membership in the Club's newsletter or by any other means of circulation approved by the Board of Directors. Not less than ten (10) days after such circulation, the application of such applicant shall be submitted to the Board of Directors for approval or disapproval. The vote of not less than seventy-five percent (75%) of the Members of the Board in attendance at the meeting of the Board of Directors shall be required for approval of such applicant to become a member of the Club.

SECTION 5. If a member's renewal form and dues payment have not been received by December 31 preceding the year of renewal, then the member may, upon board action, be placed on pending status for a period of up to one year and shall not appear in the roster for the following year. Pending status shall mean that for up to one year following the applicable December 31 renewal deadline, the pending member is eligible for reinstatement without any further action upon receipt by the Board of the member's renewal payment and renewal form.

The membership of any person who is a pending member for any consecutive one-year period shall expire at the end of such one-year-period. Notwithstanding the foregoing, a member who has failed to renew by the December 31 deadline, may not be placed on pending status if at least one board member shall state that he has personal knowledge of that member's intention not to renew membership. In such case that membership shall expire as of December 31 of that calendar year.

ARTICLE V INITIATION FEES AND DUES

SECTION 1. The annual dues for an Active, or Non-Resident Member shall be such amount as shall be determined by the Board of Directors, from time to time, plus taxes provided by law, if any. There shall be no annual dues for Junior Members of any class. Dues for calendar year 2016 is \$100 per household.

SECTION 2. In the event a member moves out of a household, the current members of the household and the departing member of the household shall retain their membership until the end of the current dues year. In the subsequent year after changing households the member shall complete a dues renewal form for the new household without the need to complete the requirements of Article IV Section 4.

ARTICLE VI ELECTIONS

SECTION 1. Four Directors shall be elected to serve in the even-numbered years for two-year terms, and five Directors shall be elected to serve in the odd-numbered years for two-year terms. Notwithstanding anything contained herein to the contrary, the term of any Director who is also serving as the President or Vice President shall be extended until the end of the term of office of such President or Vice President.

SECTION 2. The Directors, during a meeting in September of each year, shall appoint a Nomination Election Committee who shall designate a list of Active Members from which list members of the next Board of Directors shall be elected. The list shall contain at least the number of names necessary to fill all of the known vacancies. The list shall be circulated to the general membership at least fifteen (15) days prior to mailing of the Ballots. Any Active Member in good standing who so requests in writing to the Secretary prior to the expiration of the aforementioned fifteen (15) day period, shall be added to the Ballot.

SECTION 3. On or before October 31 of each year, such Committee shall mail or send electronically to each Active Member household a ballot containing the list of the nominees, including those submitted by petition, and shall enclose a return envelope marked "Ballot".

SECTION 4. Each Active Member household is entitled to one vote. No Active Member household shall cast more than one vote.

SECTION 5. All ballots received before midnight November 30 shall be counted by said Committee. The four or five persons (as the case may be) receiving the highest number of votes shall be declared elected as Directors and shall be installed at the annual meeting. In the event of a tie for the fourth or fifth director's position (as the case may be) the president will contact the individuals involved and ask if one will volunteer to withdraw. If not, the winner will be decided by a "coin toss" conducted by the president in the presence of at least one other board member or officer of the club.

SECTION 6. No Director shall serve more than two consecutive terms in any consecutive six-year period. In the event a member is elected by the Board to fill the unexpired term of any Director pursuant to Section 2 of Article VII below, no such member may serve as a Director for more than one full term and one unexpired term in any consecutive six (6) year period. The Elections committee chairperson shall keep current records of the terms of all Directors and Trustees to enable the Directors to comply with the provisions of Section 6 of Article VI and Section 3 of Article VII.

ARTICLE VII DUTIES OF DIRECTORS

SECTION 1. The Directors shall:

- A. Attend meetings of the Board of Directors.
- B. Have general supervision of all matters that come before the corporation, and act upon the same as they deem proper.
- C. Adopt rules for government of the Club not provided for in these bylaws.
- D. Fill vacancies on the Board of Directors until the succeeding annual election.
- E. During each term, a Director shall act as a Committee Chair or Co-Chair for any event, charter, or other ad hoc activity approved by the Board of Directors. In the event a Director does not comply with this section, the President will appoint said Director to any vacant Committee Chair or Co-Chair.

SECTION 2. If a member of the Board of Directors misses three consecutive meetings of the Board, such member shall be automatically dropped from his or her seat on the Board. He/she may be reinstated by the Board or a new Director may be elected by the Board to fill the unexpired term.

SECTION 3. The Directors, during their meeting in December of each year, shall, by majority vote of those present, elect Trustees of the Los Angeles Rod and Reel Club Foundation for three-year terms to replace the Trustees whose terms end on February 28 of the succeeding year. If, in February of any year, the Directors fail to elect new Trustees to replace those whose terms will end that year, then those whose terms will end shall serve as Trustees for an additional three year term. If any Trustee of the Los Angeles Rod and Reel Club Foundation shall not attend two or more Foundation meetings in any twelve month period, such Trustee maybe removed from his or her office as Trustee, subject to the sole discretion and majority vote by the remaining Trustees of the Foundation. If the Trustees vote to remove a Trustee for reasons of attendance, they shall also submit names of candidates to the LARRC board from which the board may elect a replacement.

Should a vacancy occur for any reason, including, but not limited to, resignation, disability or death of a Trustee, then the Directors shall elect a new Trustee to fill the unexpired term.

No Trustee may serve or be elected by the Board to fill either an unexpired term or a full term for more than six(6) years in any consecutive eight (8) year period. Except as expressly provided for in the paragraph immediately below, no Director or Trustee may serve concurrently in both capacities.

Notwithstanding the paragraph immediately above, the Directors may elect one or more Trustees who, at the time of such election, are then Directors, expressly provided that the term of such Directors shall terminate on the next annual meeting.

ARTICLE VIII MEETINGS

SECTION 1. The annual meeting of the corporation shall be held in February, at such time and place as the Directors may determine.

SECTION 2. Membership meetings other than the annual meeting shall be held at such times and places as the Directors may determine, or when ten or more active members request such a meeting in writing duly given to the President or Secretary,¹²

SECTION 3. The Board of Directors shall not be required to meet at any regular designated time, but shall meet upon call of the President, the Secretary, or any two members of the Board, and at such time and place as shall be designated in the call. All meetings of the Board of Directors shall be deemed regular meetings. Reasonable notice thereof shall be given.

ARTICLE IX QUORUM

SECTION 1. At meetings of the Board of Directors, five Directors shall constitute a quorum.

SECTION 2. At membership meetings, for the purpose of the transaction of business, twenty-five percent of the active membership shall constitute a quorum.

SECTION 3. In the absence of a quorum at any meeting, those present shall only have the right to adjourn until a time when a quorum can be obtained.

SECTION 4. All past Presidents of the corporation shall be ex-official members of the Board of Directors and entitled to attend all Directors' meetings but shall have no voting privileges at such meetings except as one or more of those present, if needed, shall be designated as an acting Director by the officer presiding at such meeting to complete a quorum of the Board. Designation of past Presidents as acting Directors shall be in the reverse order of the seniority in office of those present; that is, the most recent past President would be the first designated as an acting Director. However, any past President who is currently serving as a trustee of the Foundation may not be designated as an acting Director for the purpose of making a quorum.

ARTICLE X STANDING COMMITTEES

SECTION 1. The Board of Directors may establish such committees as the affairs of the corporation may require. Each member of such committee shall hold office for such period, have such authority, and perform such duties as the Board of Directors may from time to time determine.

SECTION 2. The chairman of each committee shall be appointed by the President. The committee members may be appointed by the President or by the chairman of the respective committee. It shall be the duty of each committee to take charge of all matters referred to it by the President or the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE XI VOTING

SECTION 1. Voting at any membership meeting shall be in person only.

ARTICLE XII DISSOLUTION

SECTION 1. Upon the liquidation, dissolution, or abandonment of this corporation, the assets of this corporation shall not inure to the benefit of any private person, but shall be transferred to the Los Angeles Rod and Reel Club Foundation, should same be in existence, or to a similar charitable foundation or corporation having the same tax status as to contributions, as designated by a majority of the then remaining Directors.

ARTICLE XIII AMENDMENTS

SECTION 1. These bylaws may be adopted, amended or repealed by any of the following:

A. The Directors, subject to the power of the members to change or repeal the bylaws, except that a bylaw fixing or changing the number of Directors may not be adopted, amended, or repealed without the vote or written assent of a majority of the active members, or the vote of a majority of a quorum at a meeting of the active members duly called for the purpose pursuant to the articles or bylaws.

B. The vote or written assent of a majority of the active members, or the vote of a majority of a quorum of the active members at a meeting duly called for the purpose pursuant to the articles or bylaws.

**ARTICLE XIV
RULES OF ORDER**

SECTION 1. Robert's Rules of Order (latest edition) shall govern unless the matter is covered by the articles, bylaws, or other action of the Board of Directors or membership.

**ARTICLE XV EFFECTIVE DATE
OF BYLAWS**

SECTION 1. The bylaws shall take effect immediately upon adoption.

SECTION 2. These bylaws were adopted the 18th day of December, 1972, and revised April 20, 2015.

**Los Angeles Rod and Reel Foundation
Mission Statement**

The Foundation encourages and financially supports research and educational programs that will ensure the future of recreational angling.

*LOS ANGELES ROD AND REEL CLUB FOUNDATION
DECLARATION OF IRREVOCABLE CHARITABLE
TRUST*

MAX FENMORE, MYRON J. GLAUBER and ROBERT S.THOMPSON,hereinafter called Trustees,do hereby declare that the Los Angeles Rod and Reel Club, hereinafter called Trustor, has irrevocably conveyed,transferred and delivered to the Trustees,in trust and without consideration,\$223.73 in cash. The said sum so delivered,together with all other property or money which may hereafter be transferred to this trust by any person, firm,or corporation, shall constitute and be designated the Trust Estate and shall be held by the Trustees for the following uses and purposes:

FIRST: This Trust shall be known as the Los Angeles Rod and Reel Club Foundation and all disbursements from this Trust shall be made in the name of said foundation.

SECOND: The Trustees shall hold or invest the Trust Estate and shall use the said Trust Estate as follows:

A. The Trustees shall from time to time expend all or any portion of the income or corpus of the Trust Estate as follows:

1. Provide recreational fishing opportunities for homeless, disadvantaged,at risk, under-served, or in-need individuals in the general Los Angeles area,including youth groups, community recovery facilities and veterans.
2. Provide scholarships or fund research activities that promote the understanding, health, population,and environment of California fisheries.
3. Promote the long-term interests and objectives of recreational anglers.

B. The Trustees may, from time to time, distribute all or any portion of the Trust Estate or the income therefrom to such corporations, trusts, community chest, funds, or foundations organized and operated exclusively for religious, charitable, scientific, literary or educational purposes, or for the prevention of cruelty to children or animals, no part of the net earnings of which inure to the benefit of any private shareholder or individual and no substantial part of the activities of which is carrying on propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation and contributions to which are recognized by the Treasury Department of the United States as proper deductions in computing Federal Income Taxes.

THIRD: In addition to the powers granted to Trustees by law, the Trustees hereunder shall have the power: to receive donations to this trust from any person or organization; to manage and control the Trust Estate; to establish bank accounts and to withdraw funds therefrom; to enter into contracts; to secure policies of liability and other insurance; to appoint agents to act for and on behalf of the State of California maintained by organizations which are exempt from Federal Income Tax pursuant to the provisions of Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c)(3), as said Section may be amended from time to time.

FOURTH: There shall be seven Trustees, all of whom shall be members in good standing of the Los Angeles Rod and Reel Club, a California non-profit corporation. The Trustees shall be elected at staggered intervals, so that in a three year cycle there will be two, two or three new Trustees selected each year for three year terms. Trustee terms shall expire on the date of the annual Los Angeles Rod and Reel Club banquet in February. In the event that the banquet is not held, or the LARRC makes other changes in its annual meeting timing, then the Trustee terms shall expire on December 31.

If, in December of any year, the Board of Directors of the Los Angeles Rod and Reel Club fails to elect new Trustees to replace those whose terms will end that year, then those whose terms will end shall serve as Trustees for an additional three year term.

Should a vacancy occur for any reason, including, but not limited to, resignation, disability, or death of a Trustee, then the Board of Directors of the

Los Angeles Rod and Reel Club shall elect a new Trustee to complete the remaining term of the vacated position.

FIFTH: No Trustee shall receive any compensation for his services hereunder and no part of the Trust Estate, either corpus or income, shall be distributed or inure to the benefit of the Trustor, the Trustees, and donors to the Trust, or any other private individual, corporation, firm, club, or organization, except insofar as such distributee shall qualify to receive distributions pursuant to paragraph SECOND hereof.

The Trustees are expressly prohibited from carrying on propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation in the name of this Trust.

SIXTH: This Trust may be terminated only in the event that it has no assets and, in such event, may then be terminated by a majority vote of the Trustees.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, this document has been executed this 30th day of April, 1951, at Los Angeles, California.

LARRC FOUNDATION GRANT GUIDELINES

Grants by the LARRC Foundation are governed by paragraphs (A) and (B) of the Declaration of Irrevocable Charitable Trust:

A. The Trustees shall from time to time expend all or any portion of the income or corpus of the Trust Estate for the recreation of homeless children who are residents or under the custody of institutions in the State of California maintained by organizations which are exempt from

Federal Income Tax pursuant to the provisions of the Internal Revenue Code Section 501c(3), as said Section may be amended from time to time.

B. The Trustees may from time to time, distribute all or any portion of the Trust Estate or the income therefrom to any corporations, trusts, community chest, funds, or foundations organized and operated exclusively for the religious, charitable, scientific, literary or educational purposes, or for the prevention of cruelty to children or animals, no part of the net earnings of which inure to the benefit of any private shareholder or individual and no substantial part of the activities of which is carrying on propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation and contributions to which are recognized by the Treasury Department of the United States as proper deductions in computing Federal Income Taxes.

PROCEDURAL GUIDELINES:

To assist the LARRC Foundation Trustees to interpret and implement the above guidelines, governing the grants to be made by the Foundation, the following procedural guidelines are suggested by the current Trustees. These procedural guidelines are consistent with and reflect the intent of the above institutional guidelines.

TYPES OF GRANTS:

The Trustees should consider grants which:

1. Promote the long-term interests and objectives of recreational anglers and the recreational fishing industry, and/or;
2. Enhance the general awareness and importance of maintaining healthy fishery habitats and fishery stocks, and/or;
3. Introduce economically disadvantaged youngsters residing in the general Los Angeles area to the wonders and joys of recreational fishing, and the importance of

maintaining a healthy marine environment to protect the recreational fisheries, and/or;

4. Fund research activities that promote the understanding, health, populations, environment, etc., of our state fisheries.

5. Focus on California fisheries and fishery habitat, including migratory species, immediately available to California recreational anglers.

ADMINISTRATION OF GRANTS:

1. A written proposal, defining the objectives and details of the grant request must be presented to the Foundation Trustees. The requesting agency or any club member may write and submit the proposal. Copies of the proposal must be distributed to all Foundation Trustees at least one week before the meeting and formal presentation.

2. A written response will be sent to the requesting agency/person approving or denying the request. This Grant Letter will also list any compliance restrictions, requirements or parameters under which the grant is being given. For example;

a. The Foundation shall be notified when the funds have been expended or the project is completed.

b. An LARRC member will be permitted to inspect or observe, as appropriate, the project or activity, for which the grant is being given.

c. The funds shall be restricted to the following activities/projects...

d. The funds are awarded subject to: matching funds, total project financing, etc.

3. The Foundation Secretary shall calendar this item so a Foundation trustee or club member can confirm the funds were expended in compliance with the grant requirements.

4. Following the expiration of the grant, a final report (and note to close the file) shall be made to the Trustees explaining how the funds were used and if the grantee complied with all grant restrictions.

5. All approved grants should be published in the CHUMLINE, so LARRC members know how the Foundation money is being distributed.

LOS ANGELES ROD AND REEL CLUB

FISHING RULES

The following rules, revised as of January 1, 2014, apply to catches of fish made after that date when entered intra-club competition (among our own members) for trophies, prizes, or other awards. Whenever this Club participates with other clubs in any tournaments, our members will be required to follow the particular rules governing such inter-club tournaments, even though they may conflict with these rules.

SECTION 1. Regular trophies and special awards may be awarded for catches in saltwater, fresh waters, or fly fishing.

SECTION 2. Fishing areas The term "fresh waters" is defined as lakes, rivers, and streams. As a further clarification, all species of salmon, except Coho, and those caught in landlocked bodies of water, shall be deemed caught in ocean waters. Steelhead shall be classified as "fresh water". The Board of Directors shall make the final determination in the event a particular catch requires clarification.

SECTION 3. All species of fish recognized by the International Game Fish Association at the time of the catch are eligible for trophies and/or other awards in each line test category specified in Section 12. A.1. In order to be eligible for a trophy and/or award, a calico bass must be released.

SECTION 4. Any fish caught in a sportsmanlike manner,(casting, jigging, trolling, or taken from shore) by means of live bait, dead bait, or artificial lures, is eligible to compete with any other catches in comparable line class.

SECTION 5. To qualify any fish for a trophy, certificate, or award, the following is required:

A. Fish to be weighed on a scale deemed reasonably accurate. All weighed fish should be witnessed and certified by another person. However, if the angler is fishing alone and wishes to submit the fish for a

record and release the fish alive, a reasonable effort must be made to locate another person to witness the weight of the fish and sign the certificate certifying the weight. If after a reasonable effort, no person is found to weigh the fish, the angler may self-certify the weight by declaring so and signing the weight slip indicating no other person was present and the weight is self-certified.

B. A properly verified weight certificate must be mailed to the Fishing Records Chair and postmarked within fourteen(14) days of return to port. All catches evidenced by weight certificates mailed beyond the time herein stated will be automatically disallowed, unless the member submits to the Board of Directors for its action, the weight certificate and a written explanation for the delay, and the Board resolves to accept such weight certificate. No deviation from this rule is otherwise permitted. The decision of the Board shall be final.

C. Any protest relative to the weight of a fish or to the manner of weighing must be made before the fish is removed from the weighing station (i.e. boat or landing).

D. In case of a tie in weights of fish, the first fish taken, if that fact can be determined without dispute, shall be considered the winner. Otherwise, the first fish officially weighed shall be deemed the winner, and, if that fact cannot be determined without dispute, the controversy shall be resolved by the Board of Directors.

E. Any fish taken on a particular date within a season, irrespective of the date such fish may be weighed in, shall be entered for competition in the same season. The term "season" as herein used means from January 1st to and including December 31st.

F. All fish released but not weighed may be entered for a "Release Trophy" but will not compete in line test categories. Fish may be entered for trophies and/or Club records if released, provided said fish is weighed in accordance with the rules herein prior to release.

SECTION 6. In order to qualify a fish in competition as a "released" fish for any special award which may be presented, the following is required:

A. At the time of release, either the hook must be held by hand while being purposely disengaged from the fish, or the leader must be deliberately broken or cut at a point enabling the angler to retain a portion of the leader, and the angler must have sufficient control and domination of the fish to be capable of boating the fish, should the angler choose to do so.

B. The angler must file with the Fishing Records Chair, within the same period as in Rule 5.B., above, a weight certificate marked "Released" (in lieu of weight), certified by the angler, and verified by an eyewitness to the catch.

SECTION 7. When an angler enters in competition more than one fish of the same species for the same class of tackle which would otherwise entitle the angler to more than one trophy, only one regular trophy will be presented; namely, the trophy for the largest of such fish. In other words, an angler may not be awarded a trophy for a first and second place for the same species of fishing the same line category.

SECTION 8. Separate trophies will be awarded to ladies and juniors. Any Junior Member sixteen (16) years or older may elect to have their weight certificates, trophy and record submissions entered in the adult category; once this election is made it may not be reversed. The Junior Member may make this election in writing to the chairman of the Fishing Records Committee.

SECTION 9. First place trophies may be awarded in all categories.

SECTION 10. Trophies for other outstanding catches will be awarded as determined by the Board of Directors.

SECTION 11. A special trophy for the first local game fish of the year

will be awarded, exclusive of minimum weight and line test. For the purpose of this special trophy, "local" is defined as being limited to ocean waters available to anglers departing from any port from Morro Bay south to the Mexican border, where the duration of the trip does not exceed 24 hours. The qualifying species are albacore, tuna, dorado, yellowtail, white seabass, marlin, and broadbill.

SECTION 12. The angler must land or release the fish only by the use of sporting tackle.

A. Line

1. Monofilament, multi-filament, lead core multi-filament, and spectra lines may be used in each respective class, in accordance with the maker's labeled rating in pounds or weight class.
2. Wire lines are prohibited.

B. Line backing

1. Backing not attached to the fishing line is permissible with no restrictions as to size or material.
2. If the fishing line is attached to the backing, the catch shall be classified under the top thirty (30) yards of the two lines.

SECTION 13. Any protest relative to a catch or release may be made by any member in good standing. For a protest to be valid, it must be in writing, clearly stating the reasons for the protest, and be in the possession of the Club's President no later than the later of fifteen (15) days after the disputed catch, fifteen days after return to port, or within fifteen days after the person entering the protest becomes aware of the information upon which the protest is made, whichever is later, but in no event later than ninety days (90) after the disputed catch. The President shall notify the angler that a protest has been lodged, and set a hearing at a

regulated scheduled Board of Directors meeting. The angler and the person(s) protesting shall have the right, but not the obligation, to attend the hearing. The Board of Directors, after hearing all the facts pertaining to the protest, shall make a determination, by majority vote of those in attendance, of the validity of the catch. The Board of Directors decision shall be final. In addition to the above, the Board of Directors shall have the unlimited authority to act on its own to resolve any matter involving the interpretation of the Club rules, trophies, and records.

SECTION 14. The Board of Directors shall have the right, from time to time, to change, delete, or add to any of the above rules, as may be deemed to be for the best interest of sport fishing and the members of the Club. Each of the records contained in the LARRC fishing records (following these fishing rules) shall remain a permanent record of the Club until such time as record is broken.

RULES FOR FLY-FISHING

Equipment Regulations

SECTION 1. LINE

Any type of fly line and backing may be used. The breaking strength of the fly line and backing are not restricted.

SECTION 2. LEADER

Leaders must conform to generally accepted fly-fishing customs. A leader includes a class tippet and, optionally, a shock tippet. A butt or taper section between the fly line and the class tippet shall also be considered part of the leader and there are no limits on its length, material, or strength. A class tippet must be made of nonmetallic material and either attached directly to the fly or to the shock tippet if one is used. The class tippet must be at least 15 inches (38.10 cm) long (measured inside connecting knots). With respect to knotless, tapered leaders, the terminal 15 inches (38.10 cm) long (measured inside the connecting knots) will also deter-

mine tippet class. There is no maximum length limitation. The breaking strength determines the class of the tippet. A shock tippet, not to exceed 12 inches (30.48 cm) in length, may be added to the class tippet and tied to the lure. It can be made of any type of material, and there is no limit on its breaking strength. The shock tippet is measured from the eye of the hook to the single strand of class tippet and includes any knots used to connect the shock tippet to the class tippet. In the case of a tandem hook fly, the shock tippet shall be measured from the eye of the leading hook.

SECTION 3. ROD

Regardless of material used or number of sections, rods must conform to generally accepted fly-fishing customs and practices. A rod shall not measure less than 6 feet(1.82 meters) in overall length. Any rod that gives the angler an unsporting advantage will be disqualified. Extension butts are limited to 6 inches (15.24 cm).

SECTION 4. REEL

The reel must be designed expressly for fly-fishing. There are no restrictions on gear ratio or type of drag employed except where the angler would gain an unfair advantage. Electric or electronically operated reels are prohibited.

SECTION 5. HOOKS

A conventional fly may be dressed on a single or double hook or two single hooks in tandem. The second hook in any tandem fly must not extend beyond the wing material. The eyes of the hooks shall be no farther than 6 inches (15.24 cm) apart. Treble hooks are prohibited.

SECTION 6. LURES

The lure must be a recognized type of artificial fly, which includes streamer, buck tail, tube fly, wet fly, dry fly, nymph, popper, and bug. The use of any other type of lure or natural or preserved bait, either singularly or attached to the fly, is expressly prohibited. The fact that a lure can be cast with a fly rod is not evidence in itself that it fits the definition of a fly.

The use of any lure designed to entangle or foul-hook a fish is prohibited.

SECTION 7. GAFFS & NETS

The use of a flying gaff is not permitted. Only a single hook is permitted on any gaff. Harpoon or lance attachments are prohibited.

Fly-Fishing Regulations

SECTION 1. The angler must cast, hook, fight, and bring the fish to gaff or net unaided by any other person. No other person may touch any part of the tackle during the playing of the fish or give aid other than taking the leader for gaffing or netting purposes.

SECTION 2. Casting and retrieving must be carried out in accordance with normal customs and generally accepted practices. The major criterion in casting is that the weight of the line must carry the lure rather than the weight of the lure carrying the line. Trolling a lure behind a moving water craft is not permitted. The craft must be completely out of gear both at the time the fly is presented to the fish and during the retrieve.

SECTION 3. Once a fish is hooked, the tackle may not be altered in any way, with the exception of adding an extension butt.

SECTION 4. Fish must be hooked on the lure in use. If a small fish takes the lure and a larger fish swallows the smaller fish, the catch will be disallowed.

SECTION 5. One or more people may assist in gaffing or netting the fish.

SECTION 6. The angling and equipment regulations shall apply until the fish is weighed.

SECTION 7. Acts disqualifying a catch.

- A. Failure to comply with equipment or angling regulations.
- B. The act of persons other than the angler in touching any part of the rod, reel, or line either bodily or with any device during the playing of the fish, or in giving any aid other than that allowed in the rules and regulations. If an obstacle to the passage of the line through the rod guides has to be removed from the line, then the obstacle shall be held and cut free. Under no circumstances should the line be held or touched by anyone other than the angler during this process.
- C. Resting the rod on any part of the boat, or on any other object while playing the fish.
- D. Hand lining or using a hand line or rope attached in any manner to the angler's line or leader for the purpose of holding or lifting the fish.
- E. Intentionally foul-hooking or snagging a fish.
- F. Shooting, harpooning, or lancing any fish (including sharks and halibut) at any stage of the catch.
- G. Chumming with the flesh, blood, skin, or any part of mammals.
- H. Using a boat or device to beach or drive a fish into shallow water in order to deprive the fish of its normal ability to swim.
- I. Attaching the angler's line or leader to part of a boat or other object for the purpose of holding or lifting the fish.
- J. If a fish escapes before gaffing or netting and is recaptured by any method other than as outlined in the angling rules.

SECTION 8. The following situations will disqualify a catch:

- A. When a rod breaks while the fish is being played and the break results in the rod's length being below minimum dimensions or severely impairs

its angling characteristics.

B. When a fish is hooked or entangled on more than one line.

C. Mutilation of the fish, prior to landing or boating the catch, caused by sharks, other fish, mammals, or propellers that remove or penetrate the flesh. Injuries caused by leader or line, scratches, old healed scars or regeneration deformities are not considered to be disqualifying injuries. Any mutilation of the fish must be shown in a photograph and fully explained in a separate report accompanying the record application.

Tippet Categories

Tippet records are maintained according to the wet testing strength of the line used by the angler. Records are kept in the following tippet categories, which are limited for certain species:
