is privileged this month to have as guest speakers, Natalie & Jack Webster. Both have a deep background with the American Albacore Fishing Association. (AAFA) and American Tuna Inc. Jack, is currently President of both AAFA and American Tuna. He became a licensed skipper by the time he was 18 and also ran long-range boats for the San Diego fleet. Together with 5 other fishing families Jack and Natalie formed American Tuna which is a very high-

end product carried under that label in Gelson's, Whole Foods and other fine markets across the country. These pioneers of tuna fishing will present a slice of history from the early "pole & troll fishery" in San Diego to the present. Although most tuna are now harvested in foreign waters, and canning and processing has been moved to foreign countries, in 2004 they helped found the American Albacore Fishing Association and American Tuna. This was done to help educate consumers and communities

about its products. The association represented 75 vessels during the 2009 season with Natalie facilitating the sale of about 6,000 tons of albacore during that year. Reliable sources have advised LARRC that during our cocktail hour Natalie will conduct a taste testing of their products.

SANTA MONICA RESTAURANT "THE HUMP" was found to be illegally serving whale meat at its Sushi Bar. In a story first called to *Chum Line's* attention by **Bob Selvin** it has now attracted international attention. The forces behind the recent Oscar-winning documentary "The Cove" orchestrated a sting operation using tiny cameras and microphones. The well known sushi restaurant has since closed and owners have pled guilty. The Cove is a documentary dealing with an area of Japan where dolphins are herded and slaughtered since they compete for fish with the local fishermen. The sting operators happened to have been in town to receive their Academy Awards recognition for "The Cove".

MORE BLUEFIN UPDATES

To those of our club members, and other interested parties, who read of the plight of the Bluefin Tuna in our January issue—here's a follow up. You will recall that the stock of these fish had been estimated to be 80% depleted and a meeting in Qatar was to be held in March by all interested parties to work for relief. The current quotas of 23,000 tons was just felt to be unsustainable. In order to head off a complete collapse of the Atlantic/Mediterranean stocks of Bluefin Tuna there was talk of using the CITES regulations as a weapon to stop over fishing. CITES is an international treaty, signed by most nations to help endangered species by stopping international trade in that species. CITES is short for Convention on International Trades of Endangered Species. The Europeans, with the help of Canada and Japan turned down new restrictions for fear of dislodging their commercial fisheries.

BLUE FIN TUNA/FORAGE FISH ISSUE

We attempted to get the Blue Fin Tuna/Forage Fish issue out to more recreational anglers and forwarded it to Doug Olander, Editor at Bonnier Corp. (*Salt Water Sportsman/Fishing*). Here's the response:


"Unfortunately the western world wants tuna, salmon, etc. from its fish farms. - ecologically expensive predators that consume tons of forage species; the developing world is happy with herbivorous or omnivorous fish that make so much more ecological sense --catfish, tilapia, etc. and the surge in tuna pens is significant but we have nowhere to run something like this, (the story) but you can write a letter to the editor if you can condense the message to 300 words or less".

THOUSANDS RALLY IN DC FOR THEIR "RIGHT TO FISH"

Over 20 federal lawmakers rallied with an estimated 3-5000 fishermen next to the US Capitol in a 3-hour rally. Largely organized by the RFA (Recreational Fishing Alliance) it was historic in the sense that both recreational and commercial fishermen protested together. At issue are the strict federal requirements contained in the Magnuson-Stevens Act and which has mandated rebuilding fish populations under arbitrary timetables. Jim Donofrio, of RFA, called the event a complete success as about 40 chartered buses brought in the participants. Legislators noted that US regulations have resulted in as much as 80% of fish consumed in the US has to be imported.

We are still looking for a few good teams.

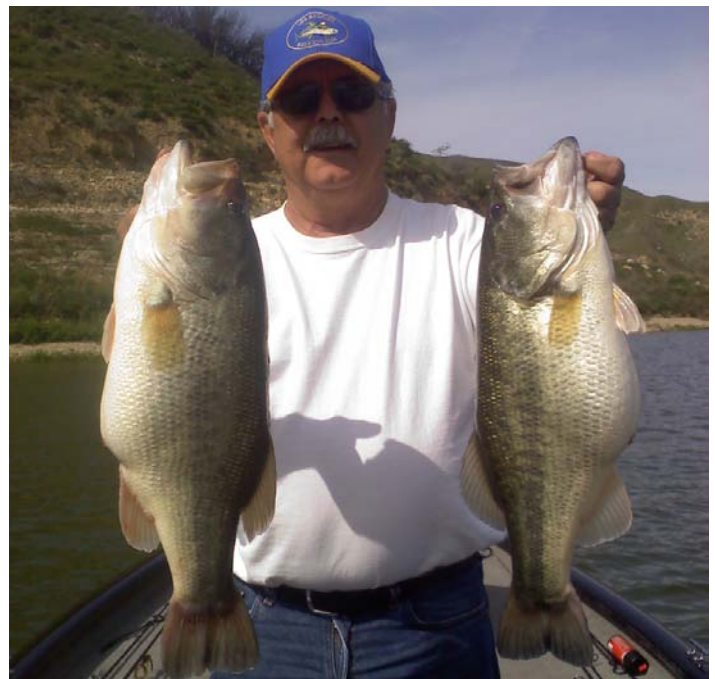

EDITORS NOTE: As a long time fisherman I am privileged to be on the mailing lists of many organizations related to our sport. Recently Earl Warren, a former President of LARRC, has taken a greater interest in such activities, since establishing a new home in the western SF Valley. He received some emails from his friend, Bill Boyce, a recent popular speaker at the club, which included some electronic communications with John Brownlee. John is the Editor of *Salt Water Sportsman* and also the esteemed Chairman of the Billfish Foundation. Bill Boyce was seeking his opinion on a deluge of emails he's received on the topic of the Obama administration and their intention of closing down sportfishing. Ultimately, Bill sent John and Earl a copy of his article published in the *Blue Water* magazine in Australia. I was copied on this and feel Los Angeles Rod & Reel Club members should be interested. You are invited to send your constructive thoughts to the *Chum Line* for possible inclusion in a future issue.

IT'S JUST HOW IT'S DONE by Bill Boyce

Here in California, ocean anglers could be facing a major reduction in our fishable real estate if the current push by the environmental groups get their way with the area closures they are pushing through the state's legislature. Closure issues are surely nothing new for you Aussies and you all know how effectively these organized and well-financed groups can "push" their agenda. Many don't do it out of callous attitude toward sport fishing, but instead support these movements through their emotions, and often out of ignorance to the data showing the minimal effect responsible sport fishing has on fish populations offshore. Anglers take the brunt of their criticism yet the commercial fleets seem to stay under the radar. Ever wonder why that is??? MONEY... MONEY... Follow the money.

I have had way too much experience in seeing how the game is played in political

management decisions. When politicians blatantly ignore an opinion you figure any intelligent person could understand, there is typically a money trail that leads to this blindness. It doesn't matter if it is the U.S, Canada, Mexico, Europe, or even Australia, money talks and science often walks. The Atlantic Bluefin fishery is a prime example.

It has been an endless three-year fight in California to save portions of our coastal waters to remain open to sport fishing. Meeting after meeting is carried out and it appears our voice is not being heard. Whose voice is being heard??? Follow the MONEY. The Packard Foundation, financed by the Hewlett Packard Computer Company (who owns the famous Monterey Aquarium) is at the forefront of the closure proposal, as is the University of California system. Why you ask??? One wants to turn the California

coast into a public owned "hands off" aquarium, and the other seeks those "fat" state-financed grant contracts to "monitor" the fish populations and ecology once they become law. In many cases, as I have written in the past, some closures are advantageous and no doubt create healthy population centers on specific habitat areas. However, the amount of water these closures target would heavily concentrate sport-fishing effort on the areas legally remaining to fish. This can never be a good scientific answer. Their issue is maximizing larval dispersion to increase fish populations. Great point, surely thriving populations of a closed area WILL create good larval production, however so would changing just a few simple management decisions that would be extremely easy to enforce. Knowledge that state and federal biologists already have.

It's all about reproduction. Let's face it, we all like to reproduce, and nature has a way of making sure it doesn't happen too soon. That is why we can increase larval production AND dispersion by having a good knowledge of our favorite fish and set minimum size limits to insure they are not harvested until they have had at least two or three years in their reproductive cycles. Imagine the travesty if we humans lost our lives before we had a chance to do so as well...!!!

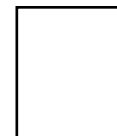
Increasing reproductive

stocks, minimizing bag limits, and stressing catch-and-release whenever possible, are all measures that WILL lead to more larval production. The obvious dispersion of their numbers will result in more fish in the near future. Management with this type of science instead of the science of emotion and closures will insure we ALL get to enjoy OUR fisheries for generations to come.

So what are we told to do??? Write our elected officials, inundate them with phone calls and emails, and protest on the steps of their offices to insure our voices are heard. That is how it is done!! NOW... To fight fire with fire, we in the angling communities would be much better served if we simply donated to a trust, and fund so to speak so that when it matures into a sizeable amount we can do what the environmental and corporate world does all over world. They BUY the votes...!!! Find out who is up for re-election and in need of campaign cash. Dangle the carrot and see how much more attention our fishing rights and closure concerns receive. Sounds illegal you say—not in the slightest. THAT IS THE GAME.
