President's Message by Frank Polak

Insurance. We all have it. Homeowners insurance, car insurance, health insurance, life insurance. And for some of us, boat insurance. In some ways, it's a bet. You're betting a small amount that someday circumstances may require the insurance company to "pay off". Luckily, most of us never need it. It may look like wasted money...until something happens.

Now let's talk about "fishing insurance." Not the kind you purchase for a trip. The premium in this case would go towards keeping things exactly as they are now. In short, paying for a "policy" to all of us fishing.

The "insurance carrier" in this case is the "Ocean Access Protection Fund." This organization is on the front lines and in the courts, fighting the legal battles against the flawed (and possibly illegal) Marine Life Protection Act process that is threatening to shut down large areas of the southern California coast. Several

organizations are involved, with OAPF coordinating the effort and doing the bulk of the fundraising.

The good news is they are already making headway with legal victories. The process of implementing closures has slowed considerably, thanks in part to the efforts of the OAPF. We're also getting a little help thanks to the economic mess that has permeated the state government in Sacramento.

The bad news is that the very non-governmental organizations that have been funding the MLPA and the closure process are now offering to assist the state in the legal fight. They are relentless. And that means we need to be as well.

Last year, the Los Angeles Rod & Reel Club donated \$5000 to OAPF. A sort of "premium" if you will to fund a "policy" with the goal of keeping our fisheries open.

One club member anonymously donated \$5000 towards the cause. Donations in smaller amounts have been made by other members. Our environmental committee is asking club members for donations. Consider it "cheap insurance!"

THE EKDAHL PLAN "B" by Nick Ekdahl

My father **Carl**, brother **Kris** and I were excited to be fishing together on our first club charter of the year on the *Pacific Dawn*, out of Ventura, March 12. You can imagine our disappointment when we got word that the trip had been scrubbed due to high winds. We knew the **Captain, Pat Cavanaugh**, was making the right decision and no one wants to be miserable on a boat in bad weather.

However, the "Fishing Ekdahls" were not to be denied a family fishing experience as Carl had come from New Mexico and **Kris** from San Diego for the weekend so we discussed our options and decided to go with Plan "B". Surf Fishing"

We consulted the tide charts and saw that it would be an extreme low tide which would reveal structure of the beach but would also mean a lack of hungry fish. We were committed to the plan and moved forward with readying our gear and packing the car for an early Saturday morning Surf Fishing Safari in Santa Monica.

The conditions upon arriving were pretty good for late winter in Southern California—little or no wind, minimal current, no clumps of seaweed floating around and the water temperature was not too cold. As expected we could see the exposed trough and holes that are normally

covered by the shore break.

We all "wet wade" in nylon trunks and surf booties so we keep our upper bodies bundled up in a few layers and you can't forget the sun-screen and wide brimmed straw hat as it may be cold but the sun will still burn you.

We are aficionados of the "light tackle" approach to surf fishing and the typical gear is a 7' to 9' spinning rods with reels loaded with 6 or 8# mono rigged Carolina style with a 1/2 to 3/4 oz egg sinker above a red bead and a swivel with a 18" or so of 6# flourocarbon leader. Tied to a #4 mosquito hook. For bait we favor Berkley Gulp, especially the 2" camo sand worm.

We surveyed the shore break from the berm to locate fishy looking spots and spread out to test our skill and try our luck. I have had good success on low tide days before but not nearly the results we had that day. Kris caught 32 Barred Surf Perch and a yellowfin croaker. I caught 22 Barred Surf Perch and our father caught 11

Barred Surf Perch. The nice thing was that about a third of the fish were "slabs" in the 11-12" range and were hardy fighters on light tackle.

Of course, the best thing

about our day was being together and sharing yet another great fishing experience; the hot bowls of posole and cold margaritas for lunch afterwards didn't hurt either...

2011 – LARRC’s LAST CHANCE TO SHINE!

IF YOU FAVOR SPORT FISHING OFF OUR COAST... YOU WILL PLEASE READ THIS AND RE-
ACT.

LAST DECEMBER THE CALIFORNIA FISH AND GAME DEPT. VOTED TO IMPLEMENT THE MLPA REGULATIONS WHICH WE’VE BEEN HEARING ABOUT FOR TWO YEARS. IF THIS FLAWED PROCESS IS NOT CHALLENGED THE RESTRICTIONS ARE EXPECTED TO BECOME EFFECTIVE BY SUMMER. FOREVER!!!

The State has not followed legal procedures, kept cloaked its deliberations, engaged biased members on the Blue Ribbon Task Force (BRTF), Science Advisory Team(SAT) and the Fish & Game Commission(FGC). These inequities are being challenged! Two suits have been filed. The first has been successfully decided by the State judiciary on our behalf. We prevailed on the Public Records Act action and were awarded \$82M in legal costs.

The second suit, UASC/Coastside/Fletcher v. FGC, filed this January, does challenge the restrictions about to be imposed by the State/Dept. of Fish & Game. We believe this suit has merit and must support it. Remember that the original language of the MLPA required all “extractive activities” to cease. The current MLPA initiative does not address oil drilling, wave energy projects, pollution, military testing...it only addresses fishing and gathering! Early on a number of major non-profit foundations gave millions to the State to underwrite the process. Scientists whose analyses differed from that of SAT were ignored.

Ocean Access Protection Fund (OAPF) has been created as a means to offset the almost \$500,000 estimated legal costs. It is administered by United Anglers of So.Cal. Our donated funds will not be used by UASC which has now gone to an all volunteer organization. The lead attorney, Marv Garrett is donating 80% of his time in order to help save our fishing rights.

We are asking every member of the club to pitch in. Please be generous if only to preserve fishing for your kids and grand kids. Think of the money you spend on fishing...is this worth the value of a trip? Part of a trip? One day?

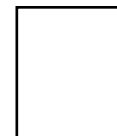
