A Guest Editorial AN ENVIRONMENTALIST'S LAMENT

I am a conservationist. I have been from the day I caught my first fish, a small bluegill and my father taught me to release it. I am an environmentalist cherishing the rivers, lakes and oceans that I fish. Long before the term environmentalism was made fashionable I spent weekends volunteering with recreational fishing and hunting groups, cleaning up streams and riverbeds, clearing out brush and restoring habitat, and fishing those same streams and rivers. I helped with brush clearance in forested areas to prevent forest fires, those same forests where I hunted.

My lament is that today, term "environmentalist" has been coopted by a rather large, well-organized, highly funded group of radicals whose aim is to eliminate all fishing, all hunting and perhaps even all pet ownerships.

Today the recreational fisherman and sporting hunter is portrayed by these groups as a creature not worthy of respect or consideration. The most unfortunate thing about this is that because they are so well-funded and their message so cleverly crafted, they are gaining ground.

If you have any doubt about this, just consider the battles we are facing now with respect to the massive fishing closures. Huge areas around the Channel Islands have been closed. There are almost 100 Marine Protected Areas along our coast that have been in existence for years without a shred of evidence that they have produced any beneficial effect whatsoever. Yet, the movement to close more and more areas continues like a runaway train. If you are a hunter or enjoy any shooting sports this is not the place to live.

There is less public land open to hunting or target shooting in California than ever before and more being closed each year.

The pity of this is that we, the sportsmen, were the original environmentalists. We took our cue from the Native Americans' example of existing in harmony with our environment, or taking only what we need and conserving the rest.

There is a huge difference between managing a resource and simply closing it to all use. The former takes a lot of effort and intelligence. The latter takes none. It is the easy and "feel good" way to approach conservation. Unfortunately the result is often disastrous.

Look no further than the problems we face with an out-of-control sea lion population here.

While we fight to retain the ability to enjoy fishing it is also important we put forth our beliefs in conserving and caring for the resource. We need to be the example that belies the negative images being spewed by the radical enviros.

And, while we are at it, please support the groups fighting to save recreational fishing. Support the Recreation Fishing Alliance by becoming a member. LARRC has become a member club member and they have, in turn, extended a free one-year membership to all members who so wish. However, the club will not sign you up without your permission. If you have not already done so, or have not returned our phone calls please do so now.

Herring Communicate by Flatulence, Study Says

Herring appear to communicate underwater using flatulence, researchers report in the *Biology Letter*. By squeezing air through anal pores, the fish produce sounds not unlike people "blowing raspberries," said the researchers, who dubbed the noises FTR's for "fast, repetitive, tick" sounds.

The British and Canadian researchers suggest the sounds may serve a social purpose, such as keeping schools of fish together or warning of predators. But the noises could also be incidental effects of buoyancy changes in the fish.

Behemoth Yellowfin Taken Off Africa

For big yellowfin tuna, 2003 has proven to be a banner year and West Africa the place. A 385-lb., 12-oz. behemoth yellowfin—just 3 pounds short of Curt Wiesenhutter's all tackle record—caught by Phillipe Marn of Togo, West Africa, will prevail as the men's 50-lb. line-class record, if approved. He caught the fish in April off Lome, Togo, West Africa, while trolling a Rapala, beating the fish in 4.5 hrs.

In May, while fishing aboard the *HOOKER* off Ghana, Candace Meyer of Longboat Key, Florida, beat a 314-pound yellowfin on 130-lb. line. IGFA representative Johan Zietsman (bluemartin@ighmail.com) reports seeing shoal after shoal of monster tuna migrating past Ghana's marlin grounds last spring.

California Bluefin Tuna Caught Off Japan

A bluefin tuna caught off California in September 1999 was recaptured again off Japan in May 2003. David Brackman of Huntington Beach, CA, tagged the 38", 35-lb. fish at the "Dumper" off the California/Baja coast on 30-pound line with a live sardine. The small Mustad circle hook was in the tuna's jaw at release. The fish was recaptured by a Japanese High School Training Program Long Line Boat 1344 days later. The fish had traveled 4,468 nautical miles, measured more than 66 inches and was estimated to weigh 212 pounds. Brackman tagged the most Pacific bluefin tuna in 1999 in the AFTCO Tag & Flag Tournament and he has had 17 tag returns since he began tagging in 1985.

Dear Marine Recreational Fishery Participants and Interested and Affected Parties:

You recently received a letter informing you of a recreational fishery closure for lingcod, rockfish, and California scorpionfish that was to go into effect on November 21, 2003. The letter also provided notice of the closure of the commercial California sheephead fishery effective on the same date.

A recent court ruling imposed a temporary restraining order halting the implementation of this recreational closure. The court concluded that affected parties had not been given adequate notice of the closure as required by regulation. As a result, the Department is issuing a revised closure notification with a new effective date. The public and Commission notification required by regulation was provided by news release on November 25, 2003.

This letter is being sent as a courtesy to inform you of the new recreational closure date. **The recreational fishery for lingcod, rockfish, and California scorpionfish will be closed in state waters effective midnight, Monday, December 8, 2003** pursuant to Title 14, CCR §27.82. The closure will apply to all recreational fishing activity for these species in all waters for the remainder of the calendar year, and include all methods of take.

This closure action conforms to recent in-season management actions taken by the Pacific Fishery Management Council (Council) to limit groundfish catches in an effort to protect fish stocks and to provide future fishing opportunities. The court order does not affect the related federal closure.

The Fish and Game Commission (Commission) also took emergency action to close recreational fishing for ocean whitefish and federal groundfish species not included in the state's closure action described above. The emergency action is intended to reduce bycatch of species in the fisheries slated for closure mentioned above and to conform to the Council groundfish actions. The fisheries affected by the Commission's emergency action will remain open in state waters until the action is filed with the Secretary of State.

Anglers are advised to check the Department's website for the most up to date regulations at www.dfg.ca.gov/mrd. For more complete information on the full scope of Council actions see www.pcouncil.org.

The Department is asking fishermen voluntarily not to fish for any these species until these closures go into effect.

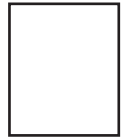
