# California Fish & Game Commission Meets in Santa Monica

On Thursday Dec. 7, 2006 and Fri. Dec. 8th, 2006, the California Fish & Game Commission will be meeting in Santa Monica. For most LARRC members, this is as close to home as they will be meeting any time in the next two years.

The second day of the Santa Monica meeting is of particular importance to anglers. If you have never attended a Commission meeting, or even if you have, this is the day to do it. On the agenda will be the Final Adoption of the 2007-2009 Sport Fishing Regulations Relating to Fish, Amphibians, Reptiles and Invertebrates. While much of this is routine, there are some alternatives on the table for which the Commission will be accepting public testimony. Individual support or opposition can make a difference. Just observing this triennial event can be very informative.

The big agenda item on Friday will be receipt of public testimony on the proposed Marine Life Protection Act Central Coast Marine Protected Areas alternatives. This will be the first in a series of three meetings that comprise the regulatory phase of the MLPA. The leadership of all the major organizations representing fishing will be there that day, to testify in an effort to convince the Commission to choose an alternative or modifications to mitigate the impact the project will have on fishermen on the Central Coast. The second such meeting will be in February on Monterey, with possible adoption scheduled for the Arcata meeting in March 2007.

So why is this important to us down here? Well, by attending you will have an opportunity to witness your representatives in action, as well as meet and talk with some of them. Consider this a dress rehearsal for when the MLPA proceeds to Southern California. When it does, we will need all the informed angler participation


we can get to mitigate the adverse impacts more new closures could have on our best fishing areas. I'm not saying that you ought to sacrifice an important day of work to attend this meeting, but for many of us the Santa Monica venue makes this much easier. It really doesn't get any easier, does it?

Even if you can't attend, you can watch the live webcast at [www.slo-span.org](http://www.slo-span.org). The meeting will start at 8:30am on Friday the 8th.

# LARRC Fishes Santa Rosa Island *by Jim Carlisle*

LARRC members and their guests gathered on Thursday evening Nov. 16 at Captain Hook's Sportfishing in Oxnard to board the *Pacific Dawn* for our final "week-end" charter of 2006. This trip had originally been scheduled to fish on Sat. Nov. 4 but that trip was rescheduled due to bad weather.

We departed at 9:30 pm and made our way towards San Rosa Island. **Capt. Pat Cavanaugh** had his excellent crew of **Mike, and Mike (AKA as Opie)** working the deck, and Vanessa in the galley. It was quite windy offshore but luckily there wasn't much swell to go with it. We made our way up the backside of Santa Cruz Island and then anchored in the lee of Rosa to wait for daylight. It turned out to be a beautiful clear morning, with warm Santa Ana winds. We had a clear view of both islands, as well as the coastline thru the Rosa-Cruz gap.

Target species was rockfish and we fished in anywhere from 150-250 feet of water. A small reel full of 30# or 50# Spectra is ideal for this type of fishing. With all the wind, the first couple of drifts were quite fast. At this point, Pat started setting up the drifts with the stern into the wind and he used the engines to control the drift. This worked extremely well and we were easily able to fish almost straight up and down along both sides of the boat.

Our fishing was outstanding early on. The spots we were fishing had a mix of suspended widow and blue rockfish, along with the nice reds and other assorted rockfish that were on the bottom. It quickly became obvious that we wouldn't have any problem filling our sacks up with these tasty

eaters. After getting a bunch of fish in the sacks, Pat started targeting smaller rocks hoping to top off the day with some bigger reds and lingcod. We had one late drift that was straight quality reds. **Richard Stone** brought in an especially large red on this drift. He was already counting the JP money when Pat decided to do a couple of last drifts targeting lingcod. Richard's guest, **Mark Manculich** brought up a beautiful ling cod at the end of the last drift that knocked Richard out of the money. Sorry Richard!.

After finishing up our rockfish limits, we made a long run down the backside of Santa Cruz Island. While the crew filleted our catch, we all enjoyed a wonderful lunch of fresh fish tacos prepared by Vanessa. After lunch, we made a few stops at Santa

Cruz, catching some whitefish and bonita. We then called it a day and headed home.

Half the anglers on this trip were guests and all fit in well with our very low-key group. If you are recruiting someone to become a club member, what better way is there to expose him or her to the club than bringing them on a charter? All in all it was a very relaxed day on the water with a nice group of anglers. During December we will be finalizing our dates for the 2007 charters on the *Pacific Dawn*. Right now it looks like we will be doing 6 charters next year.

Tentatively, we'll have 4 spring trips out of Oxnard, our annual August 1.5 day trip out of San Diego, plus a November trip out of Oxnard. Plan on joining us on a future trip! ■

# A MOST UNUSUAL CATCH

Golden Dorado are considered one of the toughest, if not the toughest fresh water fish on earth. They inhabit rivers in Northern Argentina and Southern Brazil. The largest on record is a seventy-five pounder but the average run fifteen to twenty pounds with many in the thirty-pound category reported. They have shark like teeth and a huge bony jaw that is almost impossible to penetrate with a hook.

On a recent trip to the Uruguay River in Argentina I fished for these top predators. We fished them with seven foot graphite rods (Teramar 70H-Southeast Series) and Shimano Curado 300DSV reels with either fifty-pound power pro or twenty-five pound mono. Wire leaders were a must.

All fishing for Golden Dorado, where I fished, was strictly catch and release. They are a very sturdy fish and release very well. My guide does tagging and records the statistics on the fish before release.

This is a fifty-two pound plus Golden Dorado that I caught and released. ■

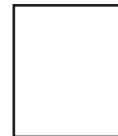
