Polaris Supreme Adventure—the Full Scoop

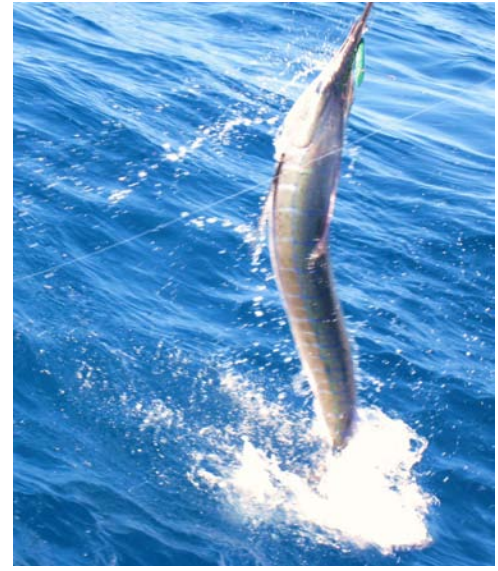
500 MARLIN AND NEAR LIMITS ON WAHOO AND DORADO by Larry Brown

Just imagine thousands of beautifully lit up marlin all around the boat jumping and free swimming, slashing at every bait, jig or wahoo bomb that hits the water. Then the electric, adrenaline-bursting run of a big wahoo after it inhales your bait or bomb if you are lucky enough to get it through the now seemingly pesky marlin. Throw in some giant bull dorado and it sounds like a fantasy fishing trip of a lifetime. That's exactly what 22 anglers experienced on the *Polaris Supreme's* 10-day charter with **Larry Brown**, Oct. 27 - Nov. 6, 2007.

"What an absolutely fantastic, unbelievable day," wrote **Skipper Tommy Rothery**. "We had more marlin than you can imagine. We hooked and released over 220 the first day, and over 300 today. The wahoo fishing was also fantastic. The group had a blast pulling in crocodile-size wahoo and huge bull dorado. The weather was good and it was just awesome on all three: wahoo, dorado and marlin."

Every bait, jig or wahoo bomb that hit the water was guaranteed to be inhaled. The question was only, "by what?" Guys were throwing out wahoo jigs and bombs, letting them sink and cranking like hell. You'd get bit on the sink or the wind, but you'd get bit. You'd hope it was a wahoo and fight like a wahoo, but 4 out of 5 times you'd see the line start to plane up to the surface just before a big marlin starting his jumping and thrashing performance. It was an awesome display of power and aerobatics. Damn ...I had wanted a wahoo!

In a taped interview Capt. Rothery exclaimed; "This is just phenomenal. The place was thick with marlin. There's lots of bait and the water is deep blue and 78-79 degrees. The frigate birds are working everywhere. I just saw a 30-lb. hooked dorado, almost at gaff, get thrashed by a big marlin 15 feet from the boat and get carried off for a marlin snack. I also saw a marlin jump on a hooked wahoo that was beaten and inches away from the gaff. This scared the hell out of the poor wahoo who proceeded to peel of 100 yards of line like he was freshly hooked. At least we landed that

wahoo."

Charter Master, **Larry Brown**, said, "I have never seen so many marlin gathered in one area in my life. International marlin fishermen would have given their right eye for this experience. We hooked and safely released over 600 marlin. It was so funny to hear curses of yet another marlin bite when we were targeting the huge dorado and wahoo. But I think we all realized and appreciated that we may have experienced marlin fishing probably never seen by other anglers—ever!"

Otto Painter Passes Away – an Obituary

Otto Painter, one of LARRC's pioneer members, died recently at the age of 99. His life was anything but dull. Otto grew up in the tough part of New York City, and for most of his life, prior to World War II, worked in the garment business. Since he usually found himself embroiled in fisticuffs, Otto decided that he might as well get paid, so he fought many (mostly losing) matches at club smokers. In the mid-thirties, while America was struggling with the great depression, Otto, along with many idealistic young people, became a member of the Communist Party. Otto joined the Abraham Lincoln Brigade, which fought Spain's dictator, Franco, in the Spanish revolution. This was another losing cause for Otto. Franco, with military aid from Hitler, put down the insurgents.

At the outset of World War II Otto joined the army, and was assigned to the 82nd Airborne Division. This elite division saw extensive action in Italy and France. Otto's war was ended when he was severely wounded during the invasion of Normandy. He was part of Easy Company that was featured in a recent series on the History Channel. During the Italian Campaign, Otto was awarded two Silver Stars for bravery. Much of his action was behind the lines, and his stories would curl your blood. Due to secrecy and speed taking prisoners was not an option.

After World War II Otto settled in Los Angeles, again sought employment in the garment industry, married lovely Henny, and got hooked on sportfishing. For reasons known only to Otto, he didn't join the club until 1965. However, he immediately became active on the board and served several terms. Predictable as death & taxes, Otto's fiery personality clashed with many, and in 1979 he quit the Club due a minor spat. In 1983 Otto wanted back in, and in a close vote that was only settled when Pres. Marvin Resnick broke the tie, Otto was back in. At the next dinner meeting I bought a much subdued Otto Painter a drink, fessed up that I had voted against his return, but welcomed him back in. Subsequently our friendship never wavered. During my stint as club president, Otto served in numerous capacities (Historian, Foundation Trustee & Chum Line Editor.) He was most instrumental in bringing club records up to date, and the change of the By-Laws that permitted lady anglers to join. Otto was extremely active in club affairs until poor health and advancing years took over in the late 90s. Very few people have had a larger impact on the LARRC than Otto. Otto Painter was preceded in death by his wife of over 50 years.

Wild Salmon at Risk in British Columbia

The authorization of three more salmon net pen licenses in B.C. has prompted 18 prominent scientists to declare that sea lice breeding on farmed salmon are threatening Pacific wild salmon.

Contamination of the wild stock is a threat unless extreme controls are instituted. Similar wild salmon declines have also been reported in Norway, Scotland and Ireland and are tied to the salmon farms.

The Freakiest Fish in the Ocean

LARRC Board Member **Mike Godfrey** recently received an email from Oceana advising him that the Galapagos Red-Lipped Batfish had won the title. We contacted this organization and show you the results below. Can anyone in the club top this?



ASA – American Sportfishing Association

ASA has occasioned a statewide survey of California adults and anglers. It was conducted by the Field Research Corporation—a nationally respected polling group. The objective was to survey public opinion about threats to ocean marine life and fish populations along the California coast in connection with the implementation of the MLPA. The results in capsule form were:

a) Concerns re: pollution, conservation of marine life and the effects of climate changes. Anglers expressed more concerns than the general public.

b) Dumping of sewage and land based pollutants are seen as the most serious threats. Only 9% of Californians feel recreational fishermen pose a serious threat.

c) Nearly all adults believe pollution is a bigger threat than recreational fishing.

d) Large majorities support the idea of establishing Ocean Parks similar to national parks on land.

e) Californians were asked about banning fishing or restrictions most seemed to prefer restrictions rather than total bans.
