Making the Case for Sportsmanship

You can find the LARRC motto on everything that the club prints: *GOOD SPORTSMANSHIP IS WORTH ALL THE FISH IN THE OCEAN.*

Within this issue of the *ChumLine* you will see published our 2003 trophy winners rewarding those who have earned some bragging rights while engaging in their favorite pastime. Larger fish may be harder to come by and trophies will turn out to be plaques. The times are changing!

It is good to note your name in this listing and it reflects on your skills, time and competitiveness. Take a moment to peruse the names and tackle used. Compare the line weights to the weight of the fish. This will give you a ratio. The lady

from Costa Mesa who boated a 38lb.11oz white seabass on 6-lb. test achieved a ratio of 6:1. Now that is an achievement and much more admirable than catching that same fish on 30-lb line. It is certainly more sporting. We know that it takes skill, good gear, time and you may lose your catch on the lighter stuff in the end. If you're going for light tackle you must not be afraid to lose your prize. (i.e. meat fishermen may not apply!) Of course the same applies for the pelagics. There you really have a sporting challenge. What's more, you have a number of variables that impact, being on a six-pack, or the number of other anglers on a party boat, weather conditions, or even a feeding frenzy, drag

washers etc. So if you caught a bluefin on 10-lb. line and it weighed in at 30lbs.12oz.—as did Brad Stich, you've got a 3:1 ratio and a lot of satisfaction. It is certainly more sporting.

You know what else is sporting? Circle Hooks. We know that this is controversial but the Costa Rican fisheries authorities have just limited all recreational billfish fishing to Circles? You could certainly have better results releasing fish. That would be more sporting as well for all game fish.

Finally, if you really want to be a good sportsman—those fish that you hold up to photo and release should be held or shown horizontally. Organs and connecting membranes may be damaged

when not being buoyed by water. (see www.info-fish.net/release-fish). Supporting fish in their normal position would really make you a sporting guy. ■

EDITORIAL COMMENTS

When I took on this job about three years ago, (a second stint) it was suggested that I NOT make an environmental newsletter out of the *ChumLine*. You've probably noted that some fish environment news sneaks in however. Basically I feel that there's not much point to having a fishing club, teach kids fishing or raise funds to perpetuate our beloved sport unless we can also maintain what is in the ocean.

Lately there's been so much news on this front that I saw this opportunity to pass some of it on. Here goes:

The Billfish Network had an article in their December Newsletter. It notes that Japan is scrapping 132 long-line vessels this year. The move is a response to concerns of overcapacity of the fishing fleets as expressed by the UN (FAO committee) The move cost 1300 fishermen their jobs. Too far from home?

After a decade of planning the US federal buyback program of vessels fishing for groundfish has removed 92 of 263 trawl vessels on the west coast, at a cost of \$36 Million. The remaining vessels will be assessed a percentage of their earnings over the next 30 years to help pay back the loan. (From a story in the February issue of National Fisherman).

Anyone out there has not heard of the Channel Islands squabble? I have a page from the Federal Register

dated Oct 2, 1980 (65200 Federal Register/Vol.45 No.193) It defines Rules and Regulations regarding the Channel Islands National Marine Sanctuary—the National Marine Sanctuary Act (NMSA) applies. Can you imagine people working on closures and restrictions since 1980? If I were to recount all that has happened regarding the Channel Islands I would need reams of pages. The lengthy process of hearings, public input etc. resulted in the DFG closing about 17.5 square miles to sport fishing and commercial take. Ventura County commercial fishermen sued for a temporary restraining order, which was denied. The plain-

tiffs were able to raise another \$175M to carry on this litigation. We expect the suit to be heard early in 2004.

This is directed to those of my LARRC friends who have never attended a hearing, written their elected officials, sent a check, or made more than a token gesture to help maintain the fishing environment. The lessons (A) There is a genuine depletion of certain species; (B) the feds are at our doors to take away more, aided and abetted by misguided enviro groups.


YOUR WAKEUP CALL— What can you do? Why not start out by reacting to this ACTION ALERT. Voice your opposition to no fishing zones

and voice your Freedom to Fish Act (F2F) support by logging on to www.freedomtofish.org and follow the prompts to send a pre-composed letter to your congressman or senator.

You can also seek out those people involved in local efforts—you know who they are!

From time to time *ChumLine* will carry such suggestions—all in the interests of maintaining our fisheries—to which you should react, assuming you want your kids and grand children to enjoy the same sport. Your comments would be welcome

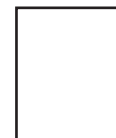
