FISHERY ITEMS OF INTEREST

OUR JANUARY EDITION OF *CHUM LINE* had a lengthy review of what is happening to the bluefin tuna. (see pages 8-9). Following up on this we report a decision on the part of ICCAT (International Commission for the Conservation of Atlantic Tunas) to reduce the Atlantic and Mediterranean bluefin catch from 22,000 tons to 13,500 metric tons. This was done to head off a move to have the bluefin declared endangered. Once a species is declared endangered international trade in that product is halted.

IN THE SOUTHEAST FISHERIES, commercials are faced with a possible closure—for 35 years—of all snappers and groupers. While final word has to come from the South Atlantic Fishery Management

Council—such a move would mean an end to bottom fishing in the area.

GOOD NEWS FOR A CHANGE...

James W. Balsiger, Acting Director of the NMFS, is quoted in *National Fisherman* (2/2010) that ICCAT has confirmed a recovery of North Atlantic Swordfish populations.

\$177,000 WAS THE PRICE paid at a recent Tsukiji (Tokyo/Japan) auction for a 513-lb. blue fin tuna. *The NY Times* (1/10/10) article noted that it was the highest price paid for the disappearing species since 2001 when a 440-lb. fish sold for \$220,000.

FROM WON (WESTERN OUTDOOR NEWS) 1/8/10.

The skipper of the *Shogun*, **Norm Kagawa**, reported that

his boat, on the way south to the tuna fishing grounds, trolled up the first albacores of the year. The location was approximately 200 miles from San Diego.

ANOTHER ITEM FROM NATIONAL FISHERMAN says

that the Pacific Fishery Management Council has been asked to develop a plan to limit West Coast Fishing for albacore. (2/1010)

A RULING ON SOUTHEAST

ALASKA halibut fishing has affirmed a **one halibut** limit for recreational fishermen. The commercial quotas have been slashed by 65%. It is expected to have quite a negative affect on Alaska tourism and charter operators. (NF 2/2010)

Winter Weather...

In case you hadn't noticed !!!

Current weather predictions were received at *Chum Line* Headquarters. A strong El Niño influence is affecting the weather in the Eastern Pacific.

Extraordinary amounts of snow at the higher elevations and maximum rainfalls in the lower part of the state are predicted. The 2-3 week period discussed may "bless" us with a whole season's worth of rain—a memorable event.

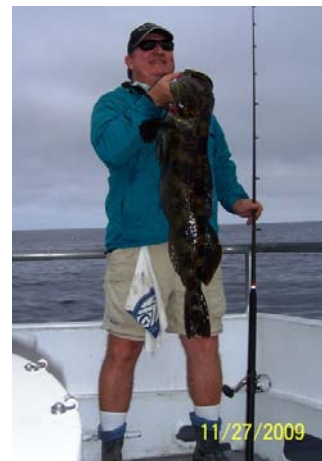

rock! We counted 20 different species in all and we caught plenty of fish; the squid really makes a difference.

One of our last stops was in front of Rocky Point and again we were catching fish. I rigged up a single hook drop-loop with a 4/0 hook and a squid head with a 6 oz torpedo weight and sent it down. I lifted and let it fall back down in between the rocks. I joked "I'm going to bounce

this off a big ling cod's head and get him angry enough to bite..." Well no sooner said than I got bit hard and heavy. Line was peeling off and Gary was there to slap my thumb off the reel as I was trying to control the fish "you know better than to thumb a reel" he said and he was right, I trusted the reel and drag and followed the fish, and about 10 minutes later we could see the monster, a big brown ling cod! Gary got the net out and under it and up it came, the largest ling I have ever caught and the largest ling the guys on the Highliner have seen for some time, especially that shallow. Whew! It ended up at 20lbs on the boat scale, the Jackpot for the day and it made some of the best fish tacos ever that night.

Fun was had by all and we are already discussing our Highliner trip in the spring. ■

Traditionally I charter a post-Thanksgiving Highliner trip, this year we went on Friday, 11-27.

We fished locally out of Redondo Sportfishing and club members on the trip were **Rob Masters, Ross Lombard and the Ekdahl clan.** Joining us was my uncle **Art Gilman.** We were all very excited as **Gary Lacroix,** Captain of the *Highliner*, had informed us that they had made plenty of live squid the day before Thanksgiving and we knew that our chances of catching some nice fish were very good as all fish love the candy bait.

The weather cooperated very well and the swell was

down which made for very comfortable fishing conditions. We headed down the line towards the Palos Verdes kelp. We anchored up and started to catch fish: Sculpin, Sand Bass, Calico Bass all wanted to play at the first stop. A hog of a sand bass looked to be the Jack Pot fish and we were all trying to beat it. Gary made a couple of moves and we caught some exotics: Leopard Shark and a couple of Trigger Fish. More sand bass and some nice red rockfish made their way into the cooler as well. At one point Rob hooked up with a really heavy fish, so heavy in fact that once he got it to the surface it turned out to be a

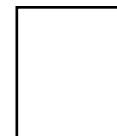
