## Foundation Awards Marine Biology Scholarships

The LARRC Foundation has awarded scholarships in marine biology to three California State University at Long Beach students. Graduate student, Kerri Loke, was selected by the Trustees to receive a \$2000 grant to help support her master's thesis work on sheephead. Carlos Mireles, whose thesis research is on the movements of fishes at the oil rigs off Long Beach, received a \$2000 award. Undergraduate student, Sarah Anderson, was awarded a \$1000 grant.

The Foundation was assisted by Dr. Christopher Lowe, Associate Professor, and Maryanne Horton, Director of Development, College of Natural Sciences and Mathematics at CSU Long Beach. Professor Lowe will act as Faculty Advisor for the scholarships. Professor Lowe, Ms Horton and the scholarship winners are scheduled to attend the LARRC dinner meeting in January to meet and get to know some of the members.

# Personal Best !

**B**randon Hayward had an article in the December issue of Western Outdoor on how some of the San Diego-based long range boats had been scoring cow tuna at Hurricane Bank. The Qualifier 105 returned early with 21 tuna over 200 lbs. Closer to home, we have a report of LARRC club member Dennis Saylor's winning a jack pot with a cow achieved on a November 28 Excel trip. See the story below submitted by Tom Carlisle.

## Hurricane Bank Kicks Out Wahoo and Cow Yellowfin

Ten LARRC members departed November 28 on the Excel for a 16-day long-range adventure. Club members on board included: 1st Captain Justin Fleck, 2nd Captain Mike Ramirez, Co/Captain Jason Fleck, Cook Vince Otani, "Big Al Scow", Dan and Brad Felger, Jan Howard, Dennis Saylor and Tom Carlisle. The target of the trip was jumbo yellowfin tuna and wahoo. We were not disappointed. After two days of riding south, Justin made a brief stop at Alijos Rocks to catch some small tuna to use as chunk bait later in the trip. We also trolled around the rocks for wahoo but saw and caught none.

The next stop was Clarion Island. After checking in with the authorities on the island, we spent a day and a half fishing the "buffer zone" (six to twelve miles off the island). The area was loaded with yellowfin tuna, mostly in the 40-50

lb class. Since we had high hopes of catching 200 lb plus tuna, Justin headed the Excel west toward Hurricane Bank.

The weather at Hurricane usually lives up to its name, but not this trip. The winds were light, the sea calm and the fishing was all we had hoped for. The big cow yellowfin tuna were there and biting and the wahoo fishing was as good as it gets. In three days of fishing at the bank, 23 yellowfin tuna over 200 lbs. were landed along with all the wahoo everyone wanted. The jackpot tuna, caught by Dennis Saylor, weighed in at 251 lbs. Dennis also had a 206. Other club members catching cows were: Jan Howard (206), Dan Felger (218), Brad Felger (218,227) and Tom Carlisle (223).

Justin then headed toward the beach to look for a few trophy super-cows (over 300 lbs) tuna. Many had

been sighted in the previous month and a handful up to 381 had been landed. We were lucky enough to see the "gigantes" boil up on the banks near Magdalena Bay but were unsuccessful in landing any. After three days of frustration, we headed north for home. Justin made a brief stop at his secret rock fish spot on the last day and those who wanted to loaded up on quality reds.

The final fish count for the trip was 230 wahoo, 124 yellowfin tuna, 1 bigeye tuna, 15 dorado, 1 grouper and 150 reds. In addition to the jackpot won by Dennis, LARRC members were winners in two additional competitions. Jan Howard took first place in the wine contest and Tom Carlisle won the Catch-and-Release contest, releasing 5 tuna over 100 lbs.

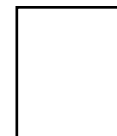
