Tim Hobbs, Fisheries Project Director, NCMC

Tim is responsible for carrying out all aspects of the National Coalition for Marine Conservation's (NCMC) conservation programs. From working with Congress and the Administration, to inform decision making, to public awareness of the threats to our ocean fisheries, Tim proactively asserts NCMC's influence to achieve conservation objectives nationwide.

Tim's interest in marine conservation stems from his lifelong passion for saltwater fishing, and he uses his first hand knowledge of fisheries to be a more effective advocate. He joined NCMC in 2000 after working in several different areas of fisheries management, including management bodies and advocacy group. He earned a B.A. in politics and environmental sciences from Whitman College in Washington State and has also studied with the Sea Education Association in Woods Hole, Mass.

We posed the question of Marine Preserves to NCMC and this is their position in brief: "NCMC believes reserves should be considered as a solution to a specific problem or to achieve a specific purpose and designed with that goal in mind. We are opposed to the use of blanket no-take zones, under the belief that activities should not be restricted unless they are demonstrably causing a specific conservation problem. No-fishing zones, and NCMC's solution to developing fair and effective MPAs are discussed in detail." Polaris Supreme 6-Day Yields Calico Bass and Albacore

The *Polaris Supreme* left Fisherman's Landing at 1:00pm on Sunday, June 16, for the annual 6-day Calico Bass Skiff Trip. On board were 16 anglers including seven LAARC members, **Al Scow, Dan Felger, Eric Rogger, Mike Grossman, Jim Carlisle, Vince Shriver** and **Tom Carlisle**, all anxious to tangle with lots of calicos and to have a chance at that elusive trophy—the double-digit calico bass. **Captain Danny Hall** and **Second Captain Chris Nickerson** led the crew of eight, which included deck hands **Kevin, Dave, Drew** and **Mike, Chef Javier** and his assistant and part-time **Skiff Captain Chris**.

Danny headed the *Supreme* for an area about 150 miles South of Point Loma with a plan to fish for albacore most of Monday. Trolling jigs were in the water at dawn and the first jig strikes came at 7:00am. There were numerous jig stops throughout the day on albacore, mostly in the 10 - 15-lb. class. "Big Al" Scow topped the days catch with a nice 25-lb. fish. At 5:00pm, when the jig lines were pulled, the count stood at 71 albacore, the *Supreme* headed for the North end of Cedros Island for the much anticipated calico bass fishing.

The *Supreme's* four skiffs were launched at dawn on Tuesday morning in the lee of the North end of Cedros. The first four, 2-man skiff

teams were fishing along with skiff Captains Chris N., Kevin, Dave and Drew by 7:00am. Skiff runs were 2 1/2 hours in length and the light load of 16 anglers allowed everyone the opportunity to fish every other run. The fishing in the lee of Cedros ranged from poor to excellent depending on time and location, with the early runs near the North end, where the current was good, producing the best. The fish were mostly on the small side, 2 - 3-lb., with the largest of the day going 5 3/4 lb. Captain Chris landed a beautiful 47-lb. yellow-tail while fishing in one of the skiffs with Al Scow and Dan Felger. All three had to work together to land the fish on light bass gear in an area with lots of kelp. By days end the

Supreme was at the South end ready to fish the extensive kelp beds in that area.

Wednesday dawned overcast and breezy. The weather kept the fishing to the boiler rocks and kelp beds within a few miles of the Cedros Island salt works. Fishing was slow with most skiff runs catching 12 - 15 calicos, but many of the fish were in the 4 - 6-lb. range. Topping the day were a pair of 7 1/4-lb. fish caught by Tom Carlisle and Rick Uribe that ended up tied for the calico bass jackpot. John

Seymour caught a 7-pounder to secure third

place. Vince Shriver caught a nice 6 1/2-lb. fish while fishing from the big boat.

The last day of skiff fishing found the *Supreme* at a windy and cloudy San Benitos Island. This fabled spot is known for lots of especially large calicos, but they were not on the bite this day. Only a few fish were caught on each skiff run and none challenged the jackpot contenders from the day before. Mike Grossman did, however, manage a beautifully colored 5-plus-pounder after almost eight hours of skiff time. There were lots of yellow-tail in the area and 37 fish in the 18 to 27 range were caught by those willing to soak lively sardines. Jim Carlisle was the hot stick, hooking five yellows

and landing four in less than an hour between skiff runs. The surface fish jackpots were won by yellowtail with Eric Rogger leading the way at 27.8 lb. followed by John Seymour at 27.6 lb. and Dennis Saylor at 26.4 lb.

The fishing wrapped up with Friday, June 21 with a few widely scattered jig strikes from small albacore in clear, blue, bumpy, 62-degree water under cloudy skies. Typical albacore weather, but uncooperative early season fish. The boat docked in San Diego on Saturday morning with 77 albacore and 37 yellowtail. As for the calico bass, most were released and are growing even larger at Cedros and San Benitos. Most if not all of the LARRC members plan to return next year in search of the elusive double-digit calico.

BOWSER STEALING YOUR FISH ?

When you go fishing you really have your hands full worrying about the obstacles to a fine day on the water. Now the seal problem seems to be increasing exponentially. For many years the Marine Mammal Protection Act has prohibited the harming or harassing all pinnipeds. Now we hear from Mike Doebley, Associate Legislative Director for Recreational Fishing Alliance (RFA), who's been attending hearings in Washington DC.

He noted that Bob Fletcher, head of the Sportsfishing Association of California (SAC), had served as a witness before a committee looking into this growing problem .

It is reported that a noise making device was developed that will discourage sea lions from approaching boats etc. and which could be used to deter their learned "misbehavior". Presumably this deterrent will not violate provisions of the Marine Mammal Protect Act.

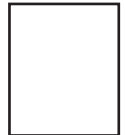
