Sportfishing doesn't get much help from the mainstream media these days, but there were a couple of interesting articles of note recently. On Wednesday, May 19, the *Los Angeles Times* ran a feature on a new "catch & release only" trip sailing Tuesdays aboard the *Toronado* at Pierpont Landing. The trips are half-day and (at least the inaugural voyage) was organized by

a group called the Sportfishing Conservancy. Their president is **Tom Raftican**, formerly of United Anglers, who suggests this could be an alternative to the "catch and keep" trips common on most open party vessels. It was interesting to note that the *Toronado* was rockfishing and not chasing surface fish. The total catch was four sculpin, 10 rockfish and a mackerel for 14 anglers. And yes, there was a jackpot (won with a 1.5lb sculpin) It remains to be seen if "catch & release" works as well when the sand bass show up this summer.

A more positive article appeared in the June edition of *Westways*, published by the Automobile Club of Southern California. Entitled "Gone Fishing", the piece centers on the author (Barry Stringfellow) returning to the sport after several years away. He sampled freshwater bass, trout, surf and, of all things a 10-day long-range trip. The article was all positive and encouraged people to go fishing and for more reasons than just to catch fish. And that in itself is good news indeed.

If tying knots has you all, well, tied up in knots, you will find the website [Animatedknots.com](http://Animatedknots.com) a real asset. They feature easy to follow instructions for all types of knots, not just fishing. Definitely worth checking out. A big Thank You to **Bert Serden** for bringing this to our attention. He uses it with great results.

Finally, we've just about sold out all our scheduled charters for the year, including the 5-day on the *Qualifier 105* and the King of the Calicos Tournament. Openings do come up from time to time so check in with the chartermasters, listed in this issue, and all issues of the *Chum Line* for the latest info.

# THE BEST MEETING OF RECENT TIMES...

Recap by Eric Rogger

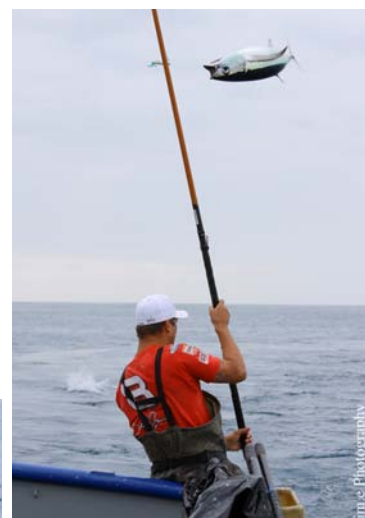
The April 28 dinner meeting turned out to be one of the highlights of many guest seasons. It featured skipper **Jack Webster** whose background in both recreational and commercial fisheries was evident. Dinner Chair, **Mike Godfrey**, was kept busy during the sell-out presentation and recorded over 48 attendees. Probably the most ever! Jack talked about the marketing of American Tuna and the creation of the Albacore Fishing Association.

AFA, formed by a small group of American fishermen, constituted of the pole and troll fishermen, they harvest the fish one at a time. The end product is hand filleted sashimi grade albacore, and is marketed by Jack's wife, Natalie, who was on hand with samples. This product is said to have a higher oil content and lower mercury content consistent with the catch of albacore in the range of 12- to 25-

lb. range. It is said to be the most regulated fishery without by-catch and has earned the West Coast Albacore Fishermen the Marine Stewardship Council's certification for

sound management and sustainability. Whole Foods and Gelsons are two of the local stores at which their prime product is available.

Coincidentally, a picture in



the June issue of *National Fisherman* attracted my attention. I called the editor to see if I might share this with LARRC members. This picture shows in a very dramatic fashion the lift poling of an albacore off the stern of one of these boats. I was turned down but referred to the photographer, "Jim E." who operated, also as a fisherman, out of Brookings, Oregon. He was kind enough to let me have the series of pictures reproduced here in the *Chum Line*.

How exciting for us, as we enter our albacore season, to see schools of fish boiling around the boat. Makes you want to run right out and sign on for another trip.

The 976 Tuna website sent out a recent report on recreational albacore catches. 2007 saw 136,483 landed. 2008 saw a total catch of 39,424. For 2009 a total of 27,027 is reported. See the *Chum Line* pages for available trips and sharpen your hooks! The commercials took about 11,580 metric tons—troll and pole fishery! With the promised El Nino year we should do well.

# **Pacific Dawn Trip, May 3rd = San Miguel Island Rockfish Bonanza** By Jim Carlisle

**S**unday evening, May 2nd, found our group of LARRC fishermen ready to depart on our final spring *Pacific Dawn* charter out of Ventura. Quite a few of us had a nice seafood dinner at Andrea's as we waited for the boat to return. After Capt. Dustin brought the boat in, the departing passengers told us of rough water all day but that the weather flattened out on their way home. Sounded like perfect timing again.

**Captain Pat Cavanaugh** was enjoying elk hunting on Santa Rosa Island so **Dustin** was our captain for the trip and **Opie** was his second. They were supported on deck by long time crew "**Man Dog**" **Mike**, and **Kenny**, with **Tanner** joining them for extra help. Whitney was back in the galley keeping us well fed. Passengers included **Jan Howard, Big Al Scow, Jim Carlisle, Capt. Justin Fleck, Dave Permut, Eric Roger,**

fish plates. All the fish served was caught fresh that day and just delicious. As usual it was another very satisfying day on the *Pacific Dawn*. If you haven't had the opportunity to fish on this boat, do yourself a favor and give them a try. The

service, comfort and friendly atmosphere are unsurpassed on a local charter boat. ■

We boarded the boat by 9 p.m., quickly signed in, and rigged tackle while the crew had dinner. After a safety speech and a bottle of wine (*thanks Dave*) we were on our way. Since the squid hadn't been around we set course straight to San Miguel Island.

Opie put us on our first shallow water drift at Miguel right at gray light. The shallow water fishing was pretty darn good on leadheads and plastics before most of the passengers were even out of their bunks. The fishing improved with sunrise and we just kept adding to our sacks as the morning progressed. Since we were fishing in shallow water, we were catching one fish at a time—big chuckles, reds, small lings etc. Late morning, Dustin decided to make a move to deeper water (300 feet) for a couple of drifts. He suggesting using two-hook ganions, or jigs with one Kenji fly. The bigger reds (Vermillion Rock Fish) were really very hungry. They just climbed on the hooks as soon as we hit bottom. Suddenly we had limits of reds so it was back to the shallows for catch-and-release then an early departure for home. **Andy MacDonald** had brought along a rockfish release device but it needed the addition of a bigger sinker to send it down with the fish. Maybe we can get it dialed up on a future trip.

On the way home **Whitney** offered up fish or chicken burritos, hamburgers, fish burgers or

## AN INVITATION!

I have fished the flats west of the Florida Keys, south of Miami. The waters are usually very shallow and there one can find bonefish, permit and a possible Grand Slam during one trip.

Boats drive through the shallows to spots favored by the guide where he takes over pushing the boats over the coral with a push pole so as to sneak up on the fish. Light spinning tackle, and or fly rods with baited shrimp or live crab, or lures and flies are supplied by the guide.

I have fished with **Jim Bennett** before and he has 2-3 friends he would recommend depending on how many want to come. He suggests a stay in Marathon which is 100 miles south of Miami and 55 miles north of Key West. Key West is an artsy town with lots of nightlife and great restaurants.

I would plan a one week excursion sometime in Mid-April next year. There would be two days of travel, three days of fishing, and one extra day reserved in case of bad weather. The cost would be about \$1500 which includes guides, airfare and car. Room costs will depend on number of people.

I can assure you that bonefish of 5-7 lbs will give you many runs before being brought to leader. A permit will be to the boat many times and the tarpon jumps will have you in awe.

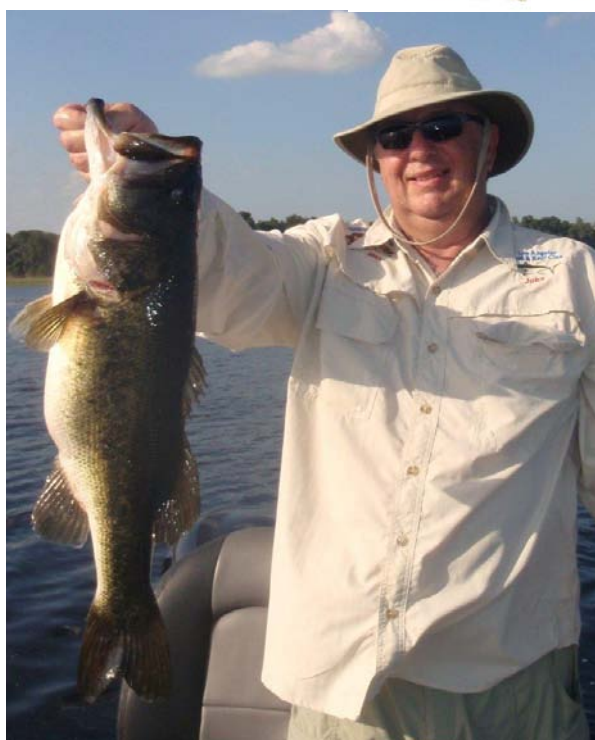

## Bass Fishing Florida Style



**M**aking the most of an Orlando, Florida golf vacation, I decided to go fishing. It was a hot muggy May afternoon when our guide picked us up promising a great afternoon of Florida-style large mouth bass fishing. Fishing had been good the previous few mornings while this was his first afternoon charter in a week. A short 30 minute ride had us at our destination, Lake Toho. Lake Toho forms the headwaters of the Everglades and it is a rather large shallow lake dominated by reeds, lillies and all sorts of critters that fly and slither. Staying in the boat was job one in this lake. Because of the strong afternoon winds the only effective fishing method was live wild shiners.

The shiners were a length of a typical sardine with a deep belly. See accompanying picture. They are a hardy fish living in the super heated waters of central Florida. We loaded the live well with 3 dozen shiners and off we went. Two things became immediately apparent as we left the harbor in the guide's Skeeter bass boat. 1) I was not used to sitting so low and close to the water, and 2) Now I know what it feels like to be on a rocket ship. Two seconds after he throttled up I was looking for the seat belts and life preservers. I figured if he hit something going as fast as he was I would be launched into near earth orbit. Needless to say, the ride to the first fishing spot was short. We set and

tossed our baits up tight to the reeds. It wasn't long before the bites started and from this spot we landed and released 6 fish with largest a 4 pound 10 oz. Beauty. The second area we fished was an underwater brush pile. The time between bites was longer but the fish were bigger. A 6 pound 3 ounce lunker came on board after a brief encounter with the anchor rope. The bass bit well with one fish hooked for every three strikes. I lost count of what we caught, but in the end we had only 7 shiners left in the well. It was a great afternoon spent on the water. ■



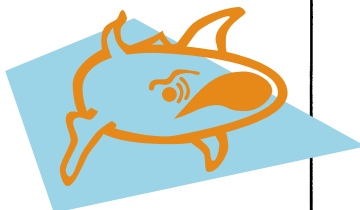

Dear Director McCamman:

It has come to my attention that the Legislative Analyst has recommended "suspension of state support" to implement the Marine Life Protection Act (MLPA). Further, the LAO recognizes that there is no long-term comprehensive plan to finance enforcement or management of marine protect areas once established. The LAO cites existing state fishing statutes such as the Marine Life Management Act and traditional fishing restrictions that could be used to enforce fishing restrictions as an alternative to this proposal.

While the MLPA may be cast as an "ecosystem approach" to protecting the ocean environment, it appears, according to the California Attorney General, that the only thing that the MLPA can actually do is to restrict commercial and recreation fishing. In fact, the Attorney General, in a September 25, 2009 letter to the Assistant Secretary of the Natural Resources Agency, clearly states on page 9 that "The State Water Resources Control Board maintains primary jurisdiction over water quality and pollution discharges". And (The MLPA...does not grant DFG or DPR new powers to enforce water quality regulations within marine reserves.) (Words in brackets added for clarification.)

After careful analysis, LAO's conclusions therefore say, in summary, the following:

1. The state does not have the resources to enforce the MLPA.
2. The state does not have the resources to manage and scientifically monitor MLPA
3. Current fishing statutes are working to protect California fisheries and, therefore the MLPA is an unnecessary program.

Given California's long-standing budget crisis where we face difficult cuts to health and safety programs, please justify for me why the Department should continue with the implementation of the MLPA. As the Legislature is required to pass a balanced budget by June 15, 2010 please provide your response to me by June 1, 2010.

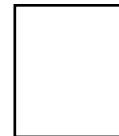
