FOUNDATION REPORT 2018

Thank you from the LARRC foundation for all your support during 2018.

The Los Angeles Rod and Reel Club Foundation is a 501(c)(3) charitable organization, established in 1951 by three of the LARRC charter members, Robert M. Thompson, Myron J. Glover, and Max Fenmore. The mission of the Foundation is to provide children in need with the opportunity to participate in recreational fishing through various programs sponsored by the Foundation. The intent is to encourage and support future generations of anglers, teaching the future anglers the skills and ethics of sportfishing while providing by example high standards of sportsmanship in recreational fishermen.

The Foundation funds the annual Kids Trip, which last year started running out of 22nd St. landing. This very successful program has administered for years at by Steven Linda Simon. The Mentor trips feature fewer anglers on one boat. Trips in 2018 took groups out of 22nd Street Landing, Ventura, and Marina Del Ray. Thanks to Scott Schiffman, Randy Sharon and Joe Mahfet, who oversaw these trips.

Another aspect of the foundation is to encourage and financially support research and educational programs that will ensure the future of recreational fishing. For many years now, the Foundation has supported graduate students in marine biology at Cal State University, Long Beach. Some

of the recipients of the scholarships have spoken at past yearly banquets, and the Chumline has run several articles regarding the fruits of their research, focused on local sportfishing issues.

The Foundation offers financial support to Friends of Castaic, a like-minded civic organization that sponsors many youth fishing programs at Lake Castaic. Foundation grants have helped the Wild Oceans Foundation conduct important research regarding forage fish in the ocean, Hubbs Sea World with the white sea bass, and the Aquarium of the Pacific.

The number of trips for young anglers and the amount of financial support given to support research varies from year to year. The Foundation has no endowments or investments. The Foundation raises money each new year, and puts the money to good use every year. Every year is a new year for fund raising and additional adventures.

The Foundation is comprised of seven trustees who are elected for three-year terms. For 2018, the trustees were Mike Godfrey, Sophia Huynh, Dave Levinson, Cathy Needleman, Scott Schiffman, Joel Steinman, and the chairman, Chas Schoemaker. Dave and Chas are terming out, to be replaced by Pamela Warren and Joe Mahfet, both of whom are past club presidents. Joel Steinman will assume the duties as Foundation chair.

Bill Poole Award

The Bill Poole Memorial award is given annually to a non-member of the LARRC who has demonstrated outstanding leadership and made the greatest impact for the advancement of recreational sportfishing.

The award is named for the legendary Bill Poole, founder of Fisherman's Landing, skipper of the Royal Polaris when the world record yellowfin tuna was caught, builder and skipper of the Excel, the largest sportfisher in the fleet, and all-around legend. The statue of Bill Poole outside of Fisherman's Landing lists seven boats that he built and/or captained. His biography is usually on sale every year at the Fred Hall Show (If you have not read this fascinating piece of angling history, pay special attention to the chapter on the first long-range trip, a Dan Felger LARRC charter to Guadalupe, captained by Bill Poole).

The recipient this year was Bart Hall. Among his many activities, Bart is currently in charge of producing the Fred Hall Show, one of the largest fishing and outdoor shows in the nation, which was started by another industry legend, Fred Hall (Bart's father). This show needs no introduction to club members, as an informal poll taken at the banquet indicated basically 100% attendance at this landmark annual event. The show has evolved over its 74 years, and now includes

instructional seminars, booths with representatives from all the Southern California landings and most of the sportfishing fleet, guides, tours, demonstrations, destination locations and a kids trout pond. About a dozen club members indicated they had attended a Hall show at a location prior to its current 40 year run at the Long Beach convention center.

Bart had a fascinating career prior to going to work for the family business. He was an accomplished jazz musician, touring the world with different artists. He has been married to his wife Ginny for fifty years.

The Hall family and organization have long supported recreational fishing in California. Currently Bart is on the state board of directors and the executive committee of the Coastal Conservation Association California (CCA CAL). This organization is the lobbying group for recreational anglers, trying to save sportfishing for future generations. Bart has been a long-time spokesperson for the advancement of recreational fishing.

At the banquet Bart gave a very well received speech, with interesting anecdotes from the Fred Hall Shows of years past. Congratulations to a friend of recreational sportfishing.

ENVIRONMENTAL MATTERS

◆ **MODERN FISH ACT.** . . This act, before Congress for several years, was signed by the President late last year. Prior to this decisions regarding our fisheries were arrived at under the Magnuson Stevens Act. What this means is that finally the needs of recreational fishing are being recognized. Recreational fishing contributes substantially to our economy. The report in Saltwater Sportsman Magazine cites that there are 11 million of us with a \$63 billion impact and 440,000 jobs. Many Organizations helped to achieve this. Among them the American Sportfishing Assn. Coastal Conservation Assn. and Recreational Fishing Alliance. Most importantly we will no longer be considered part of the commercial fishing industry.

◆ **GROUND FISH REGULATIONS.** . .New rules regarding depths at which California anglers can fish have been increased in some areas to 450 feet and cow cod areas can be fished in depths up to 240 feet while reduced daily limits of ling cod from two to one have been announced. We know this gets a bit complicated but are certain your boat crews will be able to update you.

◆ **PACIFIC SALMON CATCH.** . . A commercial magazine I subscribe to (*National Fisherman*) reported a slight increase in salmon catches during 2018. California trollers caught 670,236 lbs. of 2018 kings vs. 570,836 lbs. in 2017. However, the fleet got \$8.39 per lb. in 2017 vs. \$7.19 per lb. in 2018.

◆ **IN CASE YOU MISSED IT.** . .Scientist Alex Hall, who works and directs the Climate Science Center at UCLA, notes that we are seeing more and more changes. A NOAA report listed 14 climate related disasters in US last year. (One of these were the California Wildfires) Both agencies seemed to agree on the long term pace of global warming. The report was detailed in an article carried by the *LA Times* (Feb.7 2019)

◆ **ALL ABOUT FISHING LICENSES.** . .As reported in this column on an earlier occasion – California Fishing Licenses purchased during the course of each year were only valid until the end of that year. (i.e.) If you bought your license in September it would expire in December. We should be happy to learn that AB1387 introduced by Assemblyman Jim Wood (Santa Rosa) along with a bipartisan group of 12 other legislators, would make licenses purchased at any time during the year valid for 365 days. The bill would also require the CDFW to create an app where licenses can be displayed on mobile devices. Credit for this legislation should go to the California Sportfishing League (CSL) All fishermen should voice their support for this act.

◆ **2019 FISHING LICENSES.** . . In case you have not purchased a required current license, please note that you can do so on line - <https://www.wildlife.ca.gov/licensing/online-sales>.

A Father's Perspective 3rd Annual Parent/Kid, 5-Day Trip

Polaris Supreme – June 19 – 24, 2004

In a word “Awesome” would certainly describe this trip on the Polaris Supreme. Captain Tommy Rothery and his phenomenal crew have once again delivered beyond all expectations to twenty-four anglers, including eight kids’ under 14 years of age, a grandfather/daughter team, and a father and son in-law team. On what has become an annual event, I was on board with my ten year old son Arthur, for our second year on this father and son trip.

Our five day trip returning June 24th began with the air of a reunion, as many of our fathers and kids caught up on the last year. It was amazing to watch my son along with the other junior anglers bond as only kids do, with friendships cast long before the first jig. While heading out to sea and down the Baja Peninsula, Chef Javier prepared a beautiful Prime Rib Dinner with all the trimming, in what would become an epic gastronomic adventure. He also always prepared something for the kids.

Happy Fathers’ Day! Our first full day at sea was flat calm with typical June overcast. The flat seas would continue throughout the trip, much to my son Arthur’s delight. At daybreak we found ourselves at Benitas Island, with the opportunity to fish for Big Yellowtail. For most of the day the fish cooperated nicely, close to 50 Yellow Tail were caught from 18 to 30 pounds, with the bulk in the 22 pound range. Rocks and Seals took their toll on tackle and fish, with more than one Yellowtail exhibiting the results from the seals lunch buffet.

We spent the better half of the day catching Yellowtail, fathers and sons, side-by-side at the rail. The fishing alone made for a great day, but watching our kids, rods bent, catching monster Yellowtail was without a doubt the best Fathers’ Day present I could imagine. That night, Chef Javier served another delicious meal while heading toward the promise of Albacore the next day.

The next morning we were still heading toward the Albacore grounds, several boats had done well there the prior day. The morning fishing was spotty, with a few Albacore taken at each stop. The Albacore ranged from 18 to 30 pounds with most in the 20+ pound range. It was a lazy afternoon until close to 4:00 pm, when it seemed all the Albacore schools in the area converged under the stern of the Polaris Supreme! For the next few hours, it was utter chaos, with both seasoned and novice angler falling victim to the wide open bite. Everywhere you looked there were bent rods, with many of the kids out fishing the seasoned pros.

The Captain decided to spend the night, hoping for a repeat of the afternoon bite. That night with the sea anchors out, and calm seas, we replayed the excitement of the afternoon Albacore bite. The kids were quickly learning the art of telling a “Fish Story” and the finesse of the “One That Got Away”. After another fabulous dinner provided by Chef Javier, the junior anglers moved to the deck on a mission to catch squid, while the adults relaxed. When curfew was called the final score was 1 squid, 1 shark, and some tired junior anglers.

The morning beckoned with Captain Tommy on the horn, it was time to fish! The day was a repeat of the prior day, without the afternoon bite. Captain Tommy had no



problem finding fish; they just did not want to play. Another interesting observation was, that we were not getting hit while trolling, Tommy would see the fish stacked up and we would stop to fish, productive, but very different.

Captain Tommy was determined to make our last day of fishing, a bite to remember. And true to his word, we had an epic afternoon bite that went on until we headed toward home. By the end of the day, most everyone had their fill of Albacore, and many were releasing their fish. What an unbelievable way to end an awesome trip!

With my second trip coming to a close, I cannot help but reflect on how well the kids became a part of the community that was on the Polaris Supreme. As anglers, they displayed skill far beyond their years, even the first timers improved dramatically with each passing day. The respect that our junior anglers showed each other and the adults was impressive, and their fishing etiquette was superior to many adults, I have fished with in the past. It was obvious to all that the kids were an integral part of the trip, and not something of a hindrance.

I have referred to Chef Javier and his delicious meals. This is an understatement. The artistry and attention that he attends to each meal is exquisite. The aroma of delicate sauces tempt you long before you dine, with dishes, such as Prime Rib, Chilean Sea Bass with Mango Sauce, Crab Cakes, Rack of Lamb, and for the final night, Steak and Lobster. Javier, you are an amazing chef, and a delightful person. Fine dining on a fishing trip, with Chef Javier, it's guaranteed.

I want to thank J.C. Hardemion, Norin Grancel, Dave Ziegert and Charter Master Larry Brown for allowing me to join their evening wine tasting circle. It was a perfect compliment to Chef Javier's phenomenal cuisine.

Captain Tommy Rothery, and the crew of the Polaris Supreme, are all very professional, competent, but they are also extremely helpful. One thing you notice on the Polaris Supreme, the crew is always smiling, and always ready to help an angler, no matter how small. You have my sincere gratitude.

I would be remiss without mentioning that we had a separate jackpot for the kids. The winners in order were, 1st place Jessica Rothery (Captain Tommy's daughter), 2nd place Philip Friedman Jr., and 3rd place Chuckie Byron.

Thanks to Phillip Friedman for the T-shirts and goodies, and everyone on the Polaris Supreme, for making this years trip the success that it was. I look forward to fishing with all of you again next year!

Long Range Report

The Larry Brown 16/13 Day charter on the Red Rooster 3 returned to San Diego late February with a small but happy group of anglers. It was an ultra light load of 15 good anglers each having their own room, except for one married couple. The Red Rooster is a huge fishing platform and with only 15 anglers it seemed like it was semi private luxury. On the way to the southern zone we stopped at Alijos Rocks hoping to troll up a wahoo or two for lunch or dinner. We were greeted by hordes of hungry wahoo jumping on the new, incredible Nomad DTX 200 Minnow and mauling our jigs and bombs with reckless abandon. The new JRI Hooiside Bomb seemed especially productive. Going over daily limits could have been easy for the better anglers but good ethics and a mindful crew kept that in check. We left them biting to continue our journey to the land of giants.

When you are fishing in an area where you know a 300# tuna is likely swimming within a couple mile radius of your bait the adrenaline is always amped to a 100 plus. Yours truly was the first to connect with a small 80lb class tuna, which was donated to become sashimi, sushi, poke and AHI steaks for the next few days. It was not the giant we were looking for. A couple other fish 60 - 120 lbs came over the rail and then I connected to a monster. I was using my Avet 50 on one of the new 8ft Phenix rail rods and was very happy I didn't succumb to the temptation to drop down to 80 or 100lb rigs to match the fish we had been seeing and hooking. I have seen way too many heart aches to make that angler error. This "IS" the land of the giants and preparation and discipline are needed to win the few blessed opportunities handed to you. Experience told me this was a trophy fish. There was no doubt he was big, ie, cow class, 200+ lbs, but he was also a mean, cagey bastard too. After a couple of blistering runs he changed strategies to try cutting me off on the reef structure 100 fathoms under the boat and made multiple attempts to rap me around the anchor line. I out witted him on each of these moves. We finally settled in to a straight up and down battle, where he turned his broad side towards the boat and began circling 400 - 500 ft in the deep blue. Now it's just his will to survive Vs my will to conquer - two re-

spected gladiators in battle. Pushing my drag beyond strike I was able to keep his nose pointing slightly up so each deep circle gave me another fathom of line. Even with 35 lbs of drag he was able to pull up another 50 feet either through one last desperate attempt for freedom or the captain suggested he was being chased by sharks. Oh no, why did he mention sharks? We lose so many big fish to the huge brown sharks in this area. Larry, don't let this affect your psyche!!! I talk to myself; "No sharks, no sharks, no sharks!!!" I keep the pressure and see my 300' marker come on my reel. Another 5 minutes I get my 200' marker on my reel. I am winning the battle but realistically know this is where most big fish are lost. My fish starts to go crazy. I race from the stern to the bow. The crew grabs my rod as the fish tries to wrap around the anchor rope. I get the rod back on the other side of the bow and realize he's gone back to the stern. We run to the stern knowing he's headed straight into the props and rudders and rubbing along the chine. We luckily make it under all of that danger and settle in to our last 100' of battle. A crewman sees a flash of silver and we have deep color. I go to full drag, 40#s, and even hold the spool with my left fingers to assure he can't take an inch of line. He is doing his final death

circle 80 ' below the boat and every time he swings under the boat we are very mindful of the chine, props and rudders. My 8ft rail rod is very helpful giving me a couple extra inches of clearance but every circle is dicey. He's 30' away and 3 giant gaffs are ready for deployment. It ain't over, 'til it's over. This is where big fish test every potential weakness in your system. Knots break, connections break, hooks pull or break, line explodes, even reels and rods can fail under so much pressure. One of my buddies hooks a wahoo on the other side of the boat. His wahoo screams through the water and comes around the stern to our side just as my fish is on his outside circle. We avert disaster by millimeters. All I need is 3 feet of line for each circle and he's mine in 6 circles. Everything is working. The crew and angler are in synch. I see one crew member with 8' arms reach over the rail trying to gaff the monster but it is just out of reach. One more circle. This time two gaffs and then a third sink in and he's ours. Just another typical hour on a winter long range boat.

My fish weighed in at 251lbs and kept the number 1 place until the last two days of the trip. The last two days decided the jackpots. We welcomed a 266 and 277 onto the boat and on the very last day 82 year old Stan Malin, an LARRC member 30 years ago who had not been long range fishing for 40 years during his teaching career, landed a 308lb super cow. Mike Godfrey has already sent Stan a membership application and I'm pretty sure Stan will be rejoining the club. So get ready to welcome Stan back and congratulate him on his fish of a lifetime. And by the way, if Stan can do it, all of you can too.
