ODDS AND ENDS

ast month I wrote that our club was actively pursuing clarification of what we can and

cannot do to influence the public decision making process with regard to recreational fishing issues. Thanks to the excellent work of our Environmental Committee, Dan Fink, Eric Rogger, and Dave Levinson, along with the expert quidance from Randy Sharon, we contacted a specialist in the field of nonprofit law and received that clarification. In short, the club as a 501c4 organization can engage in unlimited lobbying activities such as letter writing, grants, and other actions intended to influence public decisions in the area of our common interest: recreational fishing. Additionally, we learned the Foundation, as a 501c3 organization, could also engage in such activities with restrictions on the amount and type of lobbying allowed. More importantly, we learned, that by the nature of the Club and Foundation's separation of management, incorporation, and accounting, there is virtually no risk of Club lobbying activities being attributed to the Foundation and thereby jeopardizing their 501(3) non-profit status. The

Environmental Committee drafted and the board approved a policy statement reflecting the Club's desire to see recreational fishing decisions made by impartial, fairminded individuals using unbiased scientific information.

While we must continue our effort on saving recreational fishing, it is even more important to do those things that will save our lives.

Wear a Personal Floatation Device (PFD) when fishing in a skiff or private boat. We all wear seat belts in our cars. It is second nature to buckle up before putting the car in drive. If you are like me, it just feels strange to be in a moving car without a seatbelt on. Wearing seatbelts saves lives. We all know that PFD's save lives. Yet most will admit to not wearing them when venturing out on the ocean or lake even when alone or in rough weather. An accident can happen in a blink of an eye. You can be an Olympic swimmer but if you are unconscious when you hit the water or the boat continues without you, you are in serious trouble. We all require children in our boats to wear PFDs. We should set an example to the point it feels strange to be in a boat without wearing a PFD.

Do you even wonder what goes on at the monthly board of director's meeting? Even if you are just a little bit curious, you should make plans to attend a meet-

■riday night, April 14, found 15 LARRC members and their guests boarding the *Pacific Dawn* at Capt. Hooks Sportfishing in Oxnard, hoping for a day of nice weather and good fishing. Participants included **Tom** Polliard, Jan Howard, Tom and Jim Carlisle, Chas. Shoemaker, Hunter & Eric Lyden, Mel Stein and Robbie Stein, Rick Uribe, Will Ebersman, Joel Zide, Dennis Braid, and Bill & Dan Haub. We were all wondering what the weather had in store for us as a wet storm snarled traffic on all the freeways that afternoon. Just when the weather looked like it had cleared up, we were greeted by another rainstorm as we loaded our gear on the boat. It turned out that was the end of the rain and we were happy to find out that the tanks were already loaded with live squid. We took off at 10 pm with Captain Pat Cavanaugh at the helm, assisted by his excellent crew of Chaz, Mike, and Johnny, plus Vanessa in the galley. Pat's 9-year-old son, Ryan was also along to catch a few fish and help out the crew.

The crossing to the islands turned out be a bit on the bumpy side, so we tucked into a sheltered spot at Santa Cruz Island to get a good night's sleep. There was a lot of squid in the area but the lack of current didn't help us attract any seabass. After daylight it became apparent the seabass didn't want to cooperate so we made the 1.5 hour run to Santa Rosa Island to catch our rockfish. It was still breezy but there wasn't a cloud in the sky and no swell to speak of. The rockfishing turned out to be excellent. There were lots of quality reds, plus an assortment of smaller chuckleheads, starrys and widow rockfish. Quite a few lingcod were caught including the jackpot fish caught by Will **Ebersman.** Shortly after an excellent lunch of fresh fish tacos, everyone finished getting their limits of quality fish. It was then time to sit back and enjoy a flat calm ride back to Oxnard.

All in all, it was a very pleasant way to spend a Saturday. The fishing was very good plus the *Pacific Dawn* is extremely comfortable to fish from. Pat and his crew provide the quality of service we normally only see on long range boats. Pat continues to upgrade the boat and he has recently added new rails, decks, generator, and freshwater tank, as well as upholstering the galley. Come join us on

SHE MALES OF THE SEA...

A report in the March issue of Salt Water Sportsman notes that sunscreen may alter fish sexually according to a new study. A chemical in sunscreen is causing male bottomfish off Southern California, such as halibut and sole, to develop ovary tissue and female egg proteins. Oxybenzone, which protects our skin from ultraviolet rays, shares some chemical properties with estrogen and is ending up on the ocean floor, says Dan Schlenk, a professor of aquatic ecotoxicology at the University of California at Riverside. When beachgoers go home and hit the showers, oxybenzone washes down the drain, survives the sewage treatment, and outfall process and ends up right on the dinner plates of a few hungry male bottomfish.

So what does this growing population of bearded -lady bottomfish mean for future stocks? Not much apparently. Schlenk said the mixed gender fish still have the ability to reproduce.



NEWS WE DIDN'T WANT TO HEAR

The Pacific Fisheries Management Council, one of eight such councils around our coasts, voted to extend the Channel Islands Marine Reserves into federal waters. In effect, the MPA's at the Islands have been doubled in size. If adopted by NOAA, this decision would be subject to periodic review and possible modification in the future. The no-fishing zones would likely be permanent for all practical purposes.
