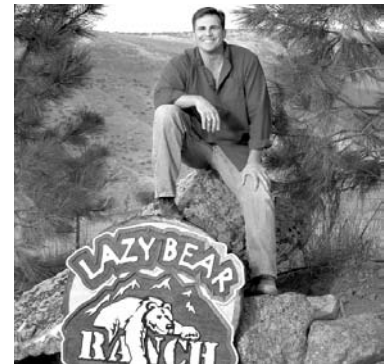

# An Absolutely EPIC Calico Bass Skiff Trip

**M**y fourth annual Northern Baja skiff trip, Oct.8-13 on the *Pacific Dawn* had fantastic fishing for calicos and was pleasantly interrupted by a frenzied, two-day white seabass bite, along with a number of large bonito, four yellowtail and lots of pesky barracuda.

Skipper **Pat Cavanaugh** estimated more than 700 calicos were caught and released by the eight anglers and five crew. There were a dozen over 7 lbs., 6 over 8 lbs. and one that went 9.9 lbs. **Chaz Shoemaker** was the only other LARRC member on board.

The white seabass fishing went STUPID on Monday and Tuesday afternoon. The first day there were only five of us on the "*Dawn*" and we put on 29 white seabass—mostly all on plastics, a few on jigs and bait.

The weather was totally pristine going down, at our fishing location and going uphill on the way home. It was so nice that we anchored right at the spot we caught the white seabass the day before. The seabass showed up again the next day, a bit later, and we got 36 more.

It was almost a fish-a-cast and if it wasn't a white seabass it was another big calico, prompting us all to yell out...."oh no, not another 5 1/2lb calico bass (about the average size of the calicos on the trip)."

Second ticket, **Chaz Govind**, actually

put on a two-hook gangion and two sardines on a heavy outfit. He went straight down in the stern of the boat and brought up two white seabass AT A TIME, jackpolding them! Hard to believe but TRUE!

These fish were all in the 15-25 lb range and catching them mostly on level-wind bass gear was great fun. Pat said that since he doesn't get to fish as much on his trips like he does on this one, this was the "best white seabass fishing he has experienced as a fisherman."

The trip went without a hitch...from the weather, to the skiff operations (three comfortable inflatables), to the fishing and

to the superb galley run by **Jeremy Fleck**.

Personally, I got nine of the 65 seabass—far and away the best bite I've ever been in—and my biggest calico was 7.8. We hooked at least two black seabass

that were on for a while, then lost, and I hooked an estimated 80- to 100-lb. thresher shark on a swimbait that gave me a rush by jumping at least three times in the 25-30 seconds that he was on. ■

**PRIVATE MONEY DRIVES A CALIFORNIA BUYOUT..**

The Nature Conservancy, an international environmental group, bought six federal trawling permits and four trawling vessels in Morro Bay. It was the first privately financed buyout of fishing vessels for conservation purposes. Though the dollar amount remains closely held, the joint effort by TNC, commercial fishermen and NOAA Fisheries will protect overfished bottom fish populations and 3.8 million acres of the ocean floor. Future buyouts are conditional on the Pacific Fishery Management Council's passage of more collaboratively designed no-trawl zones. For more information visit

## WHEN RED SHIRTS DO NOT WORK!—*Updating the MLPA process!*

By this time every recreational fisherman who learned to read in grade school is aware of the implementations to the Marine Life Protection Act of 1999 (MLPA). The state legislature enacted this largely through the efforts of a number of non-governmental organizations and well-meaning (i.e. conservation minded) legislators. At the time there was no input from the various stakeholders—recreational or commercial.

Since the State of California found itself short of funds, the act languished until early this year (2006). Resurrected, it found itself on a short track through the means of a politically appointed Blue Ribbon Task Force (BRTF) which held hearings throughout the state, so that recommendations on closures could be crystallized and forwarded to the Fish & Game Commission. The BRTF has a Scientific Advisory Team (SAT) to aid it since the task force members themselves were not necessarily involved as stakeholders. You should know that the “resurrection” came about in part due to the financial assistance of a group known as the Resource Legacy Fund Foundation (RLFF).

It is my understanding that RLFF contributed about \$7 Million to further the cause of “Saving the Ocean Environment”. \$1.2 million in public funds were also used. Major players such as the Packard Foundation and the Gordon Moore Foundation (INTEL) helped out. Probably influenced by the study conducted by the Pew Foundation Ocean Commission study and the recent US Commission on Ocean Policy study, the State of

California created the California Ocean Protection Act (COPC)(SB1319) to “Support Innovative Approaches to Sustainable Fisheries Management.” This piece of legislation seems to add another layer of bureaucracy if funded.

During meetings this month the BRTF announced their approval of a number of packages (areas designated for closure) that were the least favorable to fishermen. Remember that this is a particularly political year. It's the environment stupid! It has been suggested that the Resource Agency (A Department of the California Government) lobbied members of the decision making Fish & Game Commission, on behalf of the governor, in favor of the more restrictive choices. The stakeholder input was disregarded at the end.\* The source of this rumor was Mel DeLaMotte, who heads the Central Coast Fisheries Conservation Coalition (CCFCC).

Those red shirts, who protested the Channel Islands closures, since expanded into federal waters, need to be reminded that local commercial fishermen subsequently brought a suit in protest. It was subsequently dropped due to lack of funding. This time around some recreationals joined with a group of commercials for more clout both in terms of numbers and essential financial resources. This new entity, created in 2004, is known as the California Fisheries Coalition (CFC). The CFC sponsored a “peer” review of the SAT report, by three well-known scientists, whose comments are now being incorporated into the process. The CFC engaged a lobbyist to represent them and has also been working

with a Public Relations Firms to get our message out. We all know how notoriously difficult it has been to engage the average fisherman in the process. Readers might try [www.cafisheriescoalition.org](http://www.cafisheriescoalition.org) for a more complete background and activities information.

The scientific panel which advised the BRTF has been widely criticized. Efforts to amend MLPA constructively have largely failed although the use of private money to affect public policy doesn't seem “cricket”. An excellent critique of the task force result—from the fishermen's viewpoint—was written in June. It is called Lessons Learned. We can only hope that the Sacramento decision makers will read it closely prior to embarking on another section of the coast. (Last word has it that they will be going to the northern part of the central coast , Pigeon Point to the Bay Area.) Visit the CFC website. Final word is expected by the end of the year.

Marine Reserves, Marine Protected Areas, Closures, Ocean parks, by whatever name they go, are coming—it's the law! We can possibly mitigate the more onerous scenarios if we present a united front. This will mean working with ALL the stakeholders, including some commercial interests. To not subscribe to this will mean facing some very distasteful restrictions to recreational fishing in the future. Southern region fisherman saying “I'm going to Mexico” may not always have this option. Will the tendency to yield to the current process and hope for a “handout” later on work? I think

not. It is not certain if the Central Coast decisions will forecast the next move into Southern California waters - Pt. Conception south. Some comments were heard at recent meetings indicating a move north—Pigeon Pt. to the Bay Area. A future meeting of the Fish & Game Commission has been set for December in Sacramento and we may then see a final decision announced. Stay tuned!

## SECRETARY OF COMMERCE CARLOS GUTIERREZ ON PACIFIC SALMON


*National Fisherman* reports on the Secretary's announcement regarding a commercial salmon fisheries failure off the coast of California and Oregon. Senators and Governors of the three western states have called for emergency funds for the affected fishing communities.

The PFMC restricted salmon fishing along much of the coast. They took this step because for the third consecutive year natural spawning in the Klamath River has hit rock bottom.

The commercial salmon fishery in California and Oregon is expected to plummet by 88% and revenue is expected to drop by 84%. ■

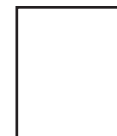
