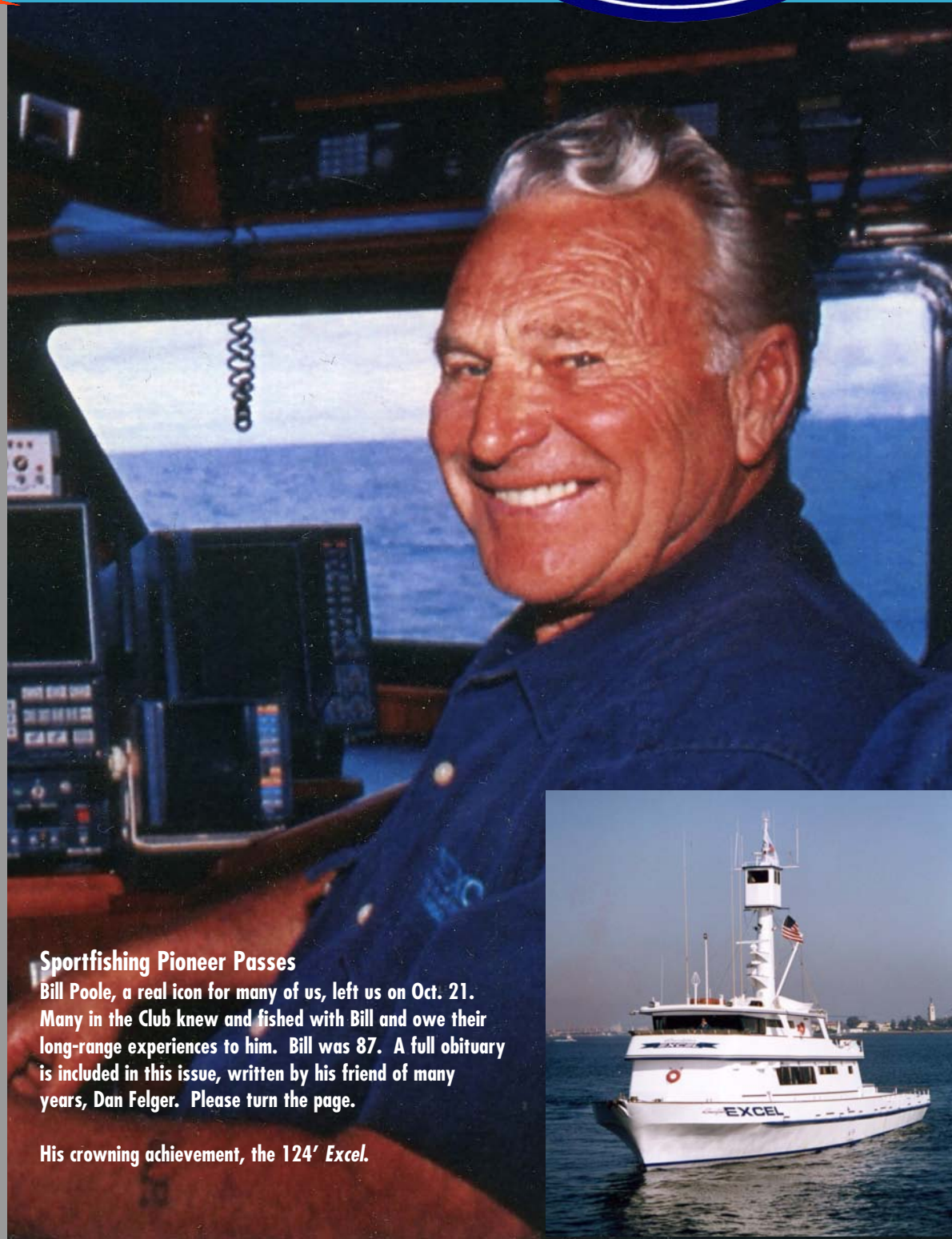

Bill Poole, a real icon for many of us, left us on Oct. 21. Many in the Club knew and fished with Bill and owe their long-range experiences to him. Bill was 87. A full obituary is included in this issue, written by his friend of many years, Dan Felger. Please turn the page.

Bill Poole, The Man

On October 21, Bill Poole lost his valiant fight with cancer. Most people will remember Bill as an icon of Sportfishing, but he was much, much more. He was not the first man to captain a sport fishing vessel on a "long range" excursion into Mexican waters. This honor belongs to the operators of the Sportfisher fleet from H & M Landing, who ran trips to Guadalupe and Cedros in the 1930's. However, after World War II, it was Captain Bill Poole, who had the vision to operate, perfect and expand long range fishing as we know it today. Commencing in the early 1950s, Bill ran 7-day trips to Guadalupe Island, later expanding to 10-day trips to the Ridge and Alijos Rocks, and ultimately 16- to 18-day adventures to the Revillagigedo Island Chain & Hurricane Bank. I had the privilege of being the Charter Master on 5 of these trips for the Los Angeles Rod & Reel Club.

The first trip was in September, 1953, and was on the 63' *Polaris*—a war surplus air sea rescue vessel. The early trips were very primitive—salt water showers, meals on deck, enough fresh water for cooking and drinking only, small fish holds consisting of ice and salt, and very rudimentary navigation (compass, watch, 2-band radio, and direction finder that was no more than a loop—in other words your destination could be in front of the boat, or behind). Bill would drive all

night, bundled up in his pea coat and watch cap. Without an enclosed bridge, Bill took the spray full in the face. Many such nights I joined Bill on the bridge, and we talked about many topics, other than fishing. It was during these times that I got to know Bill, the man, and a very special friendship flourished. It didn't take a rocket scientist to realize that Bill Poole was a very special man who was destined to succeed in life.


As the popularity of these multi-day trips increased, it was Bill Poole, who recognized the need for more comfortable boats, and the era of a combination day boat and long-range boat was over. Bill, visionary, purchased a boat yard, and built boats specifically designed for multi-day fishing, with staterooms, modern galleys, refrigerated fish holds, air conditioning, and state of the art navigation. These vessels include the *Polaris Deluxe*, *Polaris Supreme*, *Royal Polaris*, *Royal Star*, *American Angler*, *Spirit of Adventure*, *Apollo* and many more.

The son of a fisherman, Bill Poole started his career as a fisherman, and he was the best.

San Diego was the "yellowtail capital" of the world, and fish counts, which were posted daily, dictated who would command the most passengers. The *Polaris* was consistently the "high boat". However, Bill wasn't content to be just a fisherman. Over the next

several decades his accomplishments are huge: most noteworthy are his ownership of the world's largest sportfisher (*Excel*), partner in Fisherman's Landing, partner in Seaforth Sportfishing Landing, owner of the fuel dock, owner of a restaurant, proprietor of a working ranch in Montana, and world renowned big game hunter. Bill also recognized the need to help up-and-coming young owners to acquire their own boats. He did this by either lending them the needed funds or co-signing bank loans. Many boat owners today owe their start to Bill Poole. The life of Bill Poole is a real success story, and I am privileged to have had his friendship for the better part of 6 decades. However, Bill's greatest achievement in life was capturing the heart of the incredible Ingrid, his wife, partner and life companion.

Bill: We will all miss you!

MLPA—A Few Final Words

The BRTF ran out of time and was unable to decide on a preferred alternative at its Oct 20-23 meeting. A meeting is scheduled for November 10th to finalize the preferred alternative. It was clear from the task force actions that they intend not to endorse a stakeholder-developed map in its entirety. They are putting together a map using bits and pieces of the three submitted maps and drawing from previous rounds. The popular vernacular for this approach is making sausage!

Countless hours of public testimony was heard. Passionate voices from all view points pleaded with the task force members to accept their position. There were over 1000 members of the public present. I am very happy to report that the LARRC was well represented with the amount of members in attendance too numerous to identify in this article. I thought I would never be able to say that. Well done and thank you everyone! ■

CHARLES SCHOEMAKER, on behalf of the entire LARRC membership addressed the BRTF stressing the human side of the MLPA process. Earlier in the day, he was given the opportunity to address the task force with his view of the Palos Verdes area. His comments are printed here assuming the entire membership would be interested in what was said:

"My name is Charles Schoemaker and I am the immediate past president of the Los Angeles Rod and Reel Club. I am speaking to you today on behalf of 180-plus members of the club. The Los Angeles Rod and Reel Club was formed in 1950. Since then, the club and its foundation have taken more than 26,000 young people fishing. In addition, its foundation currently funds scholarships for graduate and undergraduate students in the marine biology program at CSULB. Part of the research for this program occurs at the Wrigley facility on Catalina.

I am here in support of the proposal of Work Group 2. This proposal presents a balanced and qualified approach to the implementation of the Marine Life Protection Act. It is balanced because it takes into consideration the requirements of the Act and the socioeconomic impacts of MLPA in the study region. It is qualified because it follows scientific guidelines whenever or wherever possible, only making exceptions due to extreme socioeconomic impacts what would be counterproductive if followed. The collective "on the water" knowledge of Group 2 is found in no other workgroup or state agency.

A sustainable ocean resource is in the best interests of

everyone. It can be achieved without the debilitating effect of a "bigger is better" attitude. When deciding on the preferred alternative, please put a human face on each of the proposals and its effects. In so doing, I think you will agree that Proposal 2 is the preferred alternative. The desired results can be achieved without decimating the lives and livelihood of those who use the ocean for recreation and subsistence."

"I spent a lot of time thinking about what I could possibly say at this point in time that has not already been said in the hundred of pages of written comment and numerous hours of public testimony. The SAT analysis is done, it is what it is. There is no need to rehash the sometimes mind-numbing data which will be used by many to support their point of view. What I want to tell you today is that I feel the MLPA process is more than numbers, and bar charts, and data tables and graphs. It is about marine habitats, ecosystems, and most of all people. It is about the need to coexist and sustain. Everyone rightly talks about the need for a sustainable ocean represented by the ocean-user community and businesses that support it.

The Work Group 2 proposal strikes the balance needed and allowed for in the Act and Master Plan. To chose any proposal other than 2 will immediately and permanently displace countless numbers of families dependent on the sustainable use of the ocean in the Palos Verdes area. This is not the spirit or intent of the MLPA. The framers of the Master Plan had Palos Verdes in mind when they said the SAT guidelines are not prescriptive. In this place, at this time, the needs of the community are more important than science.

Please do not lose sight of the human side of the MLPA, in doing so you will easily recognize the Work Group 2 MLPA design for Palos Verdes is the best option. I urge you to choose humanity over habitat in Palos Verdes. Thank you.

Editors Note" Former Club President Earl Warren (released from temporary exile in Costa Rica) also gave a spirited appeal on behalf of Proposal 2. It should be noted that in addition to John Ballotti recreational stakeholder reps, Joel Greenberg and Merit McCrae contributed solidly to our efforts. ■

Thanks to the Endangered Species Act, the government was able to act decisively. The net results, not to be apparent until 2020, means the removal of dams in Oregon & Washington and a new water sharing plan with farmers. The winners are the fish, farmers, and Indian Tribes. Pacific Corp., a utility that owns the dams, has promised to improve water quality and salmon habitat.

Top Seafood Ports in 2008

A report in *National Fisherman* (10/09) claims that in 2008 the Alaskan port of Dutch Harbor-Unalaska landed the most fish for the 20th year. The seafood landings were 612.7 million pounds worth \$195 million. For the ninth year New Bedford, MA rose to the top of the landings in value. They handled 146 million pounds worth \$241.3 million.

The value of overall landings for the US was \$4.4 Billion which was up slightly over the 2007 total of \$4.2 Billion. The value and volume of scallops has kept New Bedford on top.

Along with two other attorneys he was one of three who founded the LARRC—as judge on the State Court of Appeals his decisions were noteworthy. He also served 11 years as a professor of law at USC. 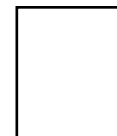
