## Chazz Shoemaker Reports on LARRC's first 8-Day Trip!

**W**e gathered, We Traveled. We fished. We traveled again. We fished some more. We ate very well. We had a wonderful time.

Twenty-two anglers gathered early on September 12 at the Point Loma Docks, eager to depart on the renovated *Qualifier 105* for the LARRC eight-day trip. The week before the "Q" had run into some debris, causing major damage to the gears, transmissions and shaft, all of which were repaired, replaced, realigned and fixed in the days prior to our departure.

The final Coast Guard approval was given that morning, and we were underway. In the midst of our travels, we stopped in the middle of the middle of the ocean, where we caught squid. The fish-finding and bait-finding ability of the boat captains are amazing.

After two beautiful travel days, we arrived at Alijos Rocks, observing scattered flurries of small fish as we traveled around, looking for the right spot. Frank Polak managed his first Wahoo and also a quality yellowfin tuna. The boat total that first day at the Rocks included 18 Wahoo, 4 yellowtail and 8 yellowfin tuna. Along with many releases.

The following day I was bit constantly, frequently by wahoo, which left half a bait. I managed a dorado, to go along with the two wahoo from the day before. The afternoon turned into a very trying time, with several people on the boat hooked up constantly, on what appeared to be big fish, without coming up with anything to prove, due to the sharks. The boat total was 3 tuna, 2 wahoo and 10 dorado, but during the afternoon it was sharks-12, LARRC-0.

**Captain Brian Sims** decided to move the boat so we made a very long night run to San Pablo Bay, where we were rewarded with a wide open yellowtail bite resulting in 179 yellowtail for the boat. After lunch the boat made the move to Guadalupe, which took all afternoon and a very bumpy night. Arriving at Guadalupe mid-morning, we found much better weather and calm seas, I was able to start the day off with 65-pound tuna. The scene at Guadalupe

was similar to an oval race track. The boat was the infield center, with the tuna racing, boiling, and crashing in large circles around the boat. We were surrounded. We ended up with 21 tuna for the day.

Next morning produced several early tuna, before the bite shut down. In the afternoon, **Ben Sussman** was very hot,

with three fish in a row, including one that went to 73.6 pounds. A short move resulted in excellent yellowtail fishing. **Rob Baldwin** had been in Kite Purgatory for the day, but removed the jinx with several yellowtail during the afternoon bite. **Tom Carlisle** made an attempt for a record yellowtail on a fly rod. 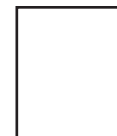
