### The Terminator Terminates the Future of Sport Fishing in the South Coast

In what will be known as Black Wednesday, the Governor placed the dagger in the heart of sport fishing in the South Coast Region.

First, only 15 minutes before the important commission meeting to listen to public comment on an extension, the terminator appointed a "lackey" of his to the vacant post which gave the fanatical environmentalists a 3-2 majority on the Fish & Game Commission.

Second, on the same day, the governor signed into law AB 2376 heavily promoted and funded by the same fanatical environmentalists which bill, in summary, provides for the following: (1) Formation of a Committee by 2010 to develop and submit to the legislature a strategic vision for the DFG and FGC, (2) such vision to include bringing in all sectors relating to fish and management and to identify other stable

funding options (to include private funding) to reduce the DFG's dependence on the General Fund, (3) creation of a blue ribbon or citizen commission to assist in carrying out such tasks. This certainly sounds like the MLPA Blue Ribbon Commission all over again.

# THERE AIN'T NO JUSTICE...

**T**he MLPA process is approaching its South Coast conclusion. We have had many opportunities to travel, contribute, send emails and join over the past couple of years. In spite of stake holder representations and compromises made, we are nearing the end of the line.

The latest flap concerns a legal requirement for an EIR (Environmental Impact Report) before such new regulations—read restrictions—(MLPA) can be passed. The recreational community, sometimes allied with commercial fishermen in order to serve a mutual interest, has applied to the Fish & Game Commission for an extension of time so that the final act may be reviewed. We are not talking about an analysis of the entire approximate-

ly 500-page report, but the conclusions reached by what is best referred to as “fish biologists”. This group of scientists contributes their reports to the Blue Ribbon Task Force (BRTF) which has been leading the initiative process. For your information, the BRTF, sends their recommendations to the Fish and Game Commission, a body of five politically appointed members who pass on the final rules.

At issue are these environmental/scientific reports and the recreational community is suggesting there has not been sufficient transparency on the part of the BRTF. Also, it has been noted that these scientists were not entirely independent and that compromises on the part of the recreational community were ignored or

passed over. Had it not been pointed out to the BRTF staff that the EIR was a legal requirement it would probably have been completely passed over.

The five member Fish & Game Commission has been equally divided lately due to fact that the fifth member, **Don Benninghoven**, was not confirmed by the State. Another commissioner, **Mike Sutkos**, an outdoorsman, was presumably not sufficiently attuned to the Schwarzenegger agenda, he was dismissed after only 18 days. We now have a new fifth member, just appointed, Jack Baylis whose background seems to be mostly in engineering. His appointment was announced about 15 minutes before a special F&G Commission meeting. This occasion was to deal

with the request for an extension of 45 days so that the controversial results of the fish biologists/scientific panel recommendations could be studied. We were given a mere 15 days! A travesty to say the least.

In summation, most of you recreational fishermen have not engaged. We ran a wanted ad in the *Chum Line* last month asking for help and **NO ONE responded!** We asked for donations to hire a noted marine biologist to support the above process. We got about five responses...enjoy your fisheries guys...while you can!

## A SEVEN DAY TRIP ABOARD THE EXCEL

### Report by Jan Howard

**T**hursday morning, Sept 9 saw our departure clearing the point about 11 a.m. with a full load of bait. A light load of 16 included LARRC club members, **Al Scow, Tom and Jim Carlisle and me, Jan Howard.**

The first and second day would be spent traveling, eating, rigging tackle, playing cards and eating some more. **Capt. Justin Fleck** gave the safety seminar and told us we were heading straight for Alijos by-passing the short range fleet fishing tuna 37 miles from the point.

Dawn of the third day we spotted the familiar peaks on the horizon announcing our arrival at the rocks. **Justin** trolled the first hour when **Charter Master Tim Turis** caught the first wahoo which went directly into the galley. Jason turned it into a fantastic wahoo salad for lunch. Once the anchor was set we began fishing for yellowfin and wahoo. Conditions were ideal! Water temp of 72.8 degrees and nearly every bait a good swimmer. We caught 97 yellowfin that first day, most

of which were 40-75 lbs.

**Bruce** caught the largest fish of day—a kite fish that weighed 133 lbs. I had a spectacular day catching a dozen yft from 40-to-75 lbs and one wahoo on mono. We had a total of 10 wahoo that day and 8 dorado plus 6 yellowtail. It was the best fishing I have seen at Alijos Rocks.

The next day fishing slowed a little but was still good. Another 45 YFT, 30 wahoo, 14 dorado and one yellowtail before we took off at 3:30 pm heading towards the beach.

Most of the fish at the rocks came on 40# line with flourocarbon leaders. There were many Shimano Talicas on board which performed very well. I fished the new **Mustad Offset Circle Hooks** exclusively on this trip. They worked well.

Monday morning we arrived early at Abreojeos and found green, cold water. We got small barracuda and bonito before we took off for Cedros. Travelling all day and arrived about 6:30pm. After dinner bait making time saw us try for squid to be used on seabass next morning.

The fish showed up by 4 am for those

fishing dropper loops. The yellowtail were all quality fish—30-pounders. Then an occasional white seabass but then they were gone by 5:30 am. I caught plenty of yellowtail but no white seabass. Tom and Jim each caught two and Al Scow one. We put 9 white seabass on and 114 yellowtail on the boat before moving to Benitos.

There we experienced more yellowtail and

a spectacular sundown bite on big calico bass thanks to the squid. What a great way to end a trip!

Due to rough offshore weather we hugged the coast home and experienced a wonderful ride. The jackpot was that 133 lb tuna. Second place was 69.7 YFT and third was a 65.5 lb YFT. ■

He arrived promptly at 8:15 pm and announced the day's catch ....one albacore.

No problem. We have had very successful trips with Pat in the midst of tuna droughts. Warm weather, calm seas and fish reported at 35-45 miles from San Diego. Here we come.

We hit the grounds at dawn to see no less than 100 boats. We got in line and trolled, and trolled and trolled. **Randy Sharon** got first-blood with a nice yellowfin. We plunked away at 'um and got 35 more—all nice grade. Everyone got a chance at the kite!

Monday started slow. Randy again led the way with a nice bluefin. 16 more in the box followed all 10- to 20-pounders. Off we went in search of a trifecta—albacore. On the way we saw, close up, 2 really big blue whales. Fantastic!

6 pm and the first jig strike of the trip. Albacore! Randy got the first bait fish next. Then things proceeded to heat

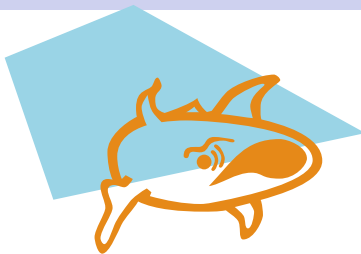

## Salmon, Halibut and Nature Fishing July 1st - July 5th

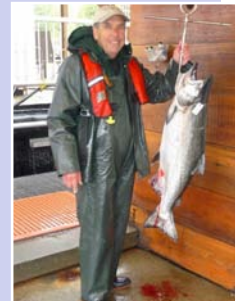
For the second year, we return to **North King Lodge** to fish the protected waters for runs of salmon as they return to the rivers of their birth as well as for hefty halibut.

Several hundred miles north of Vancouver in a desolate bay, the only fishermen to be seen for the entire duration of your trip is our group! Fish in well-equipped boats with tackle using barbless hooks (for salmon). North King provides every room with a well marked chart of spots that have been productive in the past and which allow the angler to choose guided, partially guided or unguided options with confidence.

Your boat will be cleaned and refueled whenever you return to the dock. You can return to the lodge at any time for lunch or other reasons, since the fishing areas are close by. For the diehard fisherman, you can have your lunch delivered to your boat and get comfort knowing your boat is available from dawn (6am) to dusk (10pm). Your room has two complete en-suite facilities, and the lodge provides warm pants and jackets, boots and rain gear. Tackle and bait are provided as well.

Packages range from \$3200 to \$3700 depending on the guiding option chosen and may even be reduced by an additional \$300 if we meet certain numbers of reservations. Airfare to Vancouver and gratuities are not included. This trip is limited to the first 20 callers, and we already have half that number.

A suit was brought against the BRFT, the Science Advisory Team and other defendants. The Partnership for Sustainable Oceans (PSO) is supporting this action. Members of PSO include: American Sportfishing Assn., The Berkley Conservation Institute, Avalon Tuna Club, Coastside Fishing Club, IGFA, National Marine Manufacturers Assn., Shimano, Sport Fishing Assn of California, Southern California Marine Assn., and Watermen's Alliance.

**Bob Fletcher**, longtime past head of SAC (Sportfishing Assn.of California) is spearheading the effort for the group.


The petition claims that the MLPA is in direct violation of the California Public Records Act. A Sacramento Legal firm has been retained as of May of this year.

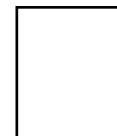
