## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

**B**y the time you read this, it will be past Labor Day. Fall is just a few weeks away. Football season is here.

It also means another year of LARRC youth programs is in the books. Success all the way around. Lots of first time anglers entering into a new world.

The Lou Berke Trout Derby and the annual Kid's Trip have been covered in previous issues, so that leaves the mid-summer Marine Mentors Trips.

This report will spare you the details (like fishing was tough as the water in Santa Monica Bay was cold... in the high 50's) but everybody caught fish and seemed to enjoy themselves.

Over the years the chairpersons for the various trips have made some interesting observations about our young guests. Keep in mind that the world through a child's eyes is very different from ours. And that's a good thing.

So here they are, in no particular order:

- **If It's New, It's Exciting:** Just about every saltwater trip begins with the loading of live bait. Nothing special there....unless you haven't seen it before. Kids crowd around the bait tank to get their first look at more fish than they've ever seen in one place. One girl in her mid-teens on the 2nd Mentors' trip dipped her hand into the tank to touch the sardines, then recoiled, fearful they would bite! For some reason the ritual of scooping bait out of the pens and into the tank fascinates young minds.

- **The Stranger the Better:** The *Betty-0* had live squid on our first trip, setting off squeals of delight from the elementary school-aged group from L.A.'s Best. It seemed that half the trip the kids kept poking at them, trying to get the candy bait to squirt. Guaranteed none of the youngsters had seen live squid before. It was more fun than actually fishing. And possibly more educational.

- **Kids Love Dolphins:** Even the most cynical teenager gets excited when dolphins start jumping

around the boat. Seasick kids scramble to the rail and even those who seem disinterested in the trip snap-to at the sight of these friendly marine mammals. Both Mentors' trips saw lots of dolphin as there is plenty of bait (maybe too much) in the bay and the dolphins (and seals) go on a feeding binge. If they clear the water chasing bait it's better than a Sea World show....without the lines.

- **Boys vs. Girls--Girls Win!:** We tend to think of fishing as a "guy thing." Guess again. My Mentors trip co-chair, **Michael Grossman** noticed a distinct behavior pattern several years ago when we did separate boys and girls trips. The boys (more than half the group) became seasick and gave a minimal effort the rest of the day. Nothing seemed to motivate them. The girls, on the other hand, were exactly the opposite. Oh, they got seasick. But they kept right on fishing. And were interested in everything. The first fish on the boat that particular outing was a guitar fish. You would have thought we had found the Loch Ness Monster. The girls touched it, poked at it, photographed it and asked endless questions. To this day, if a Club member hooks a fish and calls for someone to reel it in, the girls charge the rail en masse for the opportunity. The boys, well.....not so much.

If you want to see any of this up close, be sure to sign up for a trip next summer.

# SLIM PICKINS ON Q105, 5-DAY TRIP

**O**n Saturday, July 25th, 24 LARRC members, including some family and friends, set sail on the annual Q105 trip out of Point Loma Sportfishing for a 5-day fishing adventure. Based on fish reports the previous week, there were high hopes that this trip would be equal to, or better than the great trip we had last year. Chartermaster **Dave Levinson** put together an outstanding group of skilled and friendly players, a well-tested boat, great captain and crew, beautiful weather conditions, and delicious meals. But the albacore refused to cooperate. Only 32-total albies were caught the entire trip. All the other sportsboats fishing in the same area had similar results, some doing much worse than the Q105.

and Jiro.

We decided to go for albacore due south about 80 miles below the border rather than fish for small yellowtail at Cedros Island. This decision would allow us to have almost twice the fishing time and the chance to score some big albies.

The first day began on a promising note. Dave P. caught the first troll fish on a \$7 plain cedar plug from Walmart. Then he caught the first baitfish which won him a beautiful LARRC jacket. Larry's daughter and grand daughter each landed a nice albacore as did David F, Shelly F., Phil B, Marv S, Mike H, Eric R. and Sam R. A total of 22 fish were caught—3 by David P. Little did we realize that fishing would get slower.

The following 3 days were spent endlessly trolling with very few stops in between. One stop produced 8 fish. All

together David P caught 6 of the total fish (32) landed. He had the hot stick! Jackpot was a 31-lb. fish by Wayne. Eric had second place and Shelly third.

The jackpot had a prize of a \$200 gift certificate donated by Wayne's Malibu Tackle Shop. He generously donated it to the Foundation. Last year 13 players averaged 20-25 fish each!.

That's fishing.

# How to Have a Beautiful Trip without Tuna!

**A**ugust 7 was the long awaited departure date for my *Polaris Supreme*, 5-day charter. Let me tell you that the whole fleet has been fretting this season waiting for the magic of albacore. Never mind the economy! Some have combined trips, some have cancelled and other have gone with light loads of anglers. We did—with 15 players!

After a bit of consultation, Skipper **Tom Rothery**, decided to head due south but he would be keeping his ears open to any positive offshore reports. Nothing positive occurred, so we made a direct line for Cedros—a three hundred mile run. Offshore waters were in the low 60's and some of that June gloom was still with us.

Waking up in the dark at Cedros was eerie. Some were up at 4 a.m. testing their dropper loop skills or fly-lining with sliding sinkers to get the bait down. When finally the sun came up I could only marvel at the acres of bait in the calm water. This calm would be disturbed by an occasional burstlike explosion of water and scattered bait followed by an enormous sea lion. We lost only a few hookups to these beasts!

Daylight saw us make several moves and fish being caught, mainly on jigs and fly lined sardines. I won't bore you with too many details but this day and the next was one where at least several of us were hooked up most of the time. The activity resulted in a total of 225 yellowtail, to 40 lbs. With an additional 65 fish released, it turned out to be a fisherman's heaven—if only one could forget catching tuna!

Kind things need to be said about the conditions...with fifteen people there were virtually no tangles but this was a not so great situation for the boat owner. Our food was excellent (never had steak and lobster on a boat before etc.) service outstanding, and some real nice camaraderie.

Coming back we made stops at Benitos

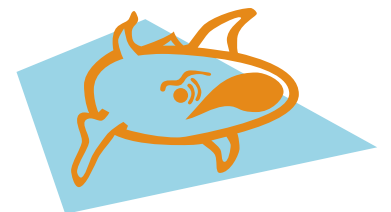

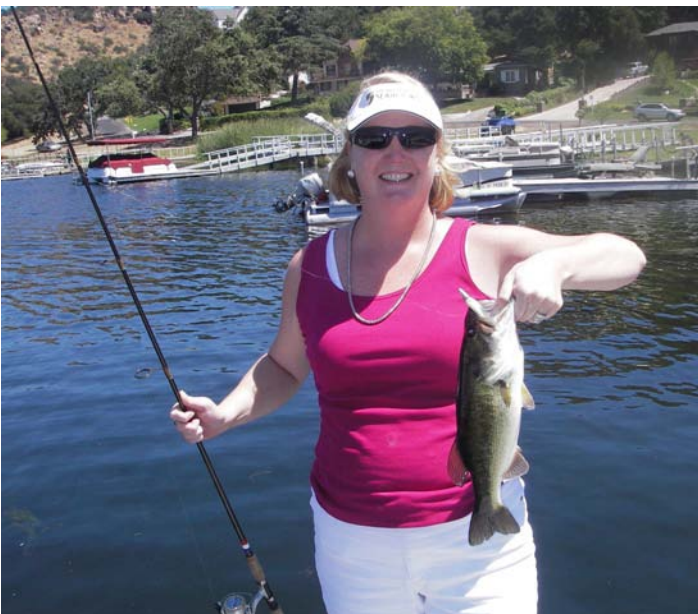
# The Annual LARRC Picnic, by Steve Simon

Boat rides on Dan Felger's yacht and kids catching fish were the highlights. Everyone seemed to have a good time. Looking forward to doing it again next year. ■

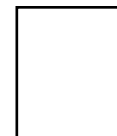
