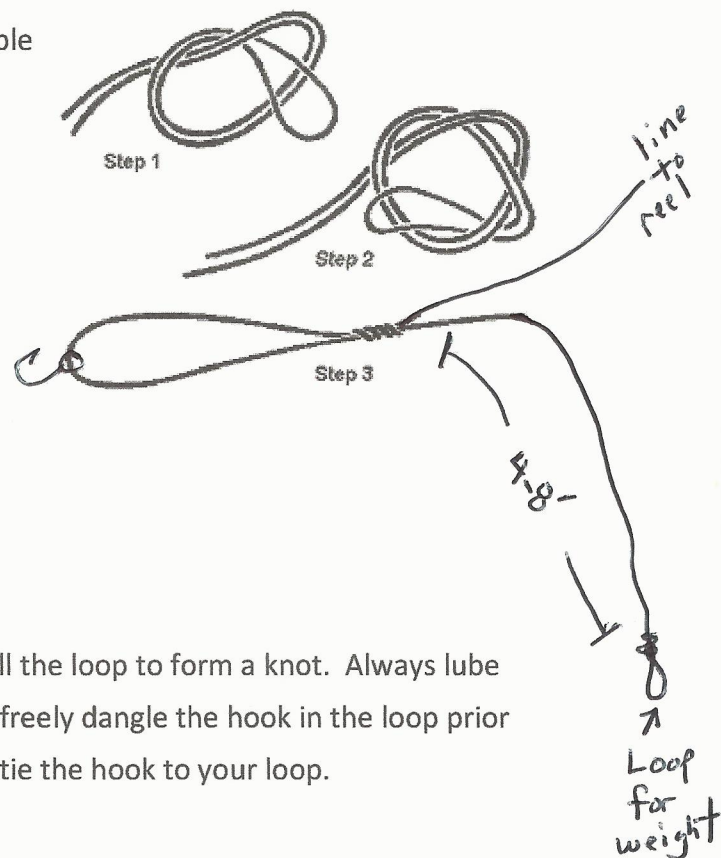


Dropper Loop

The Dropper Loop is used for Bottom Fishing for Yellowtail, White Seabass, Grouper or other Bottom Dwellers.

Using a "mid line" **Surgeons Loop** is a fast, easy and strong knot perfect for the job. You'll be using heavy monofilament line because visibility and fluoro are not issues at depth or at night when we frequently use dropper loops.

1. About 8 – 10 ft up from the tag end of your mono double it over to form a loop of the required size.*
2. Tie an Overhand Knot at the desired point, leaving the loop open.
3. Bring the doubled line through the loop again 3 more times.



4. Hold the main line and tag end together and slowly pull the loop to form a knot. Always lube the knot with plenty of saliva or spray bottle. You can freely dangle the hook in the loop prior to forming the knot or use a double San Diego knot to tie the hook to your loop.

* For yellowtail the final loop after securing your hook should be about 12 inches long and your weight should be about 4 – 5 ' below the loop. For WSB your hook should dangle about 18 inches away from your main line and be about 8' above your weight. Using a swivel or forming another loop at the tag end will allow you to change weights to suit changing current conditions.
